## PREFACE

This report is based on information obtained by licensing boards during the 2012 license renewal process. Copies of practitioner responses to questions on license renewal applications were provided to the Health Statistics Branch by the licensing boards. It should be noted that, because the data was collected by several boards using questionnaires designed to meet the licensing requirements of the individual professions, a certain consistency of format and content, desirable for manpower measurement, is missing from the data. Various items of demographic data, e.g., ethnic origin and gender, are obtained by some, but not all, of the boards. Information relating to a practitioner's location- address, city, county, state, etc.- meets the licensing board's need to communicate with the practitioner by mail and may or may not identify the site(s) where health related services are actually performed.

The report includes tables, maps and graphs representing health professions manpower distribution and demographics in Arkansas counties. The 2010 Census from the U.S. Census Bureau, Population Division, was used in the computation of population ratios throughout this report.

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**Acknowledgement:** We wish to express our gratitude to the licensing boards of these professions for their cooperation in providing requested access to their license-renewal files.

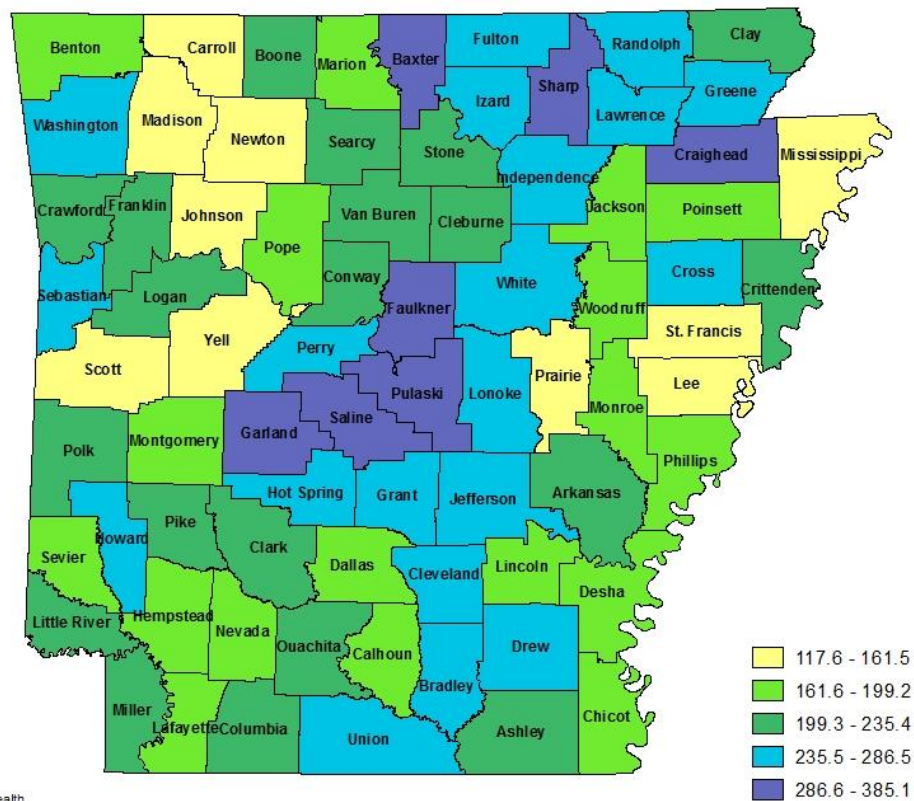
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## Health Professionals in Arkansas

In 2012, there were 76,803 licensed health professionals with Arkansas mailing addresses serving 2.94 million Arkansans, a population ratio of 260 professionals for every 10,000 population living in the State. There were 17 professions administered by 13 boards. The largest registration was by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing with 47,451 licensees, followed by the Arkansas State Medical Board with 9,303 licensees. The smallest registration was by the Arkansas Board of Podiatric Medicine with 70 licensees. As a group, health professionals were distributed fairly evenly across the counties with a heavier concentration in counties with larger populations.

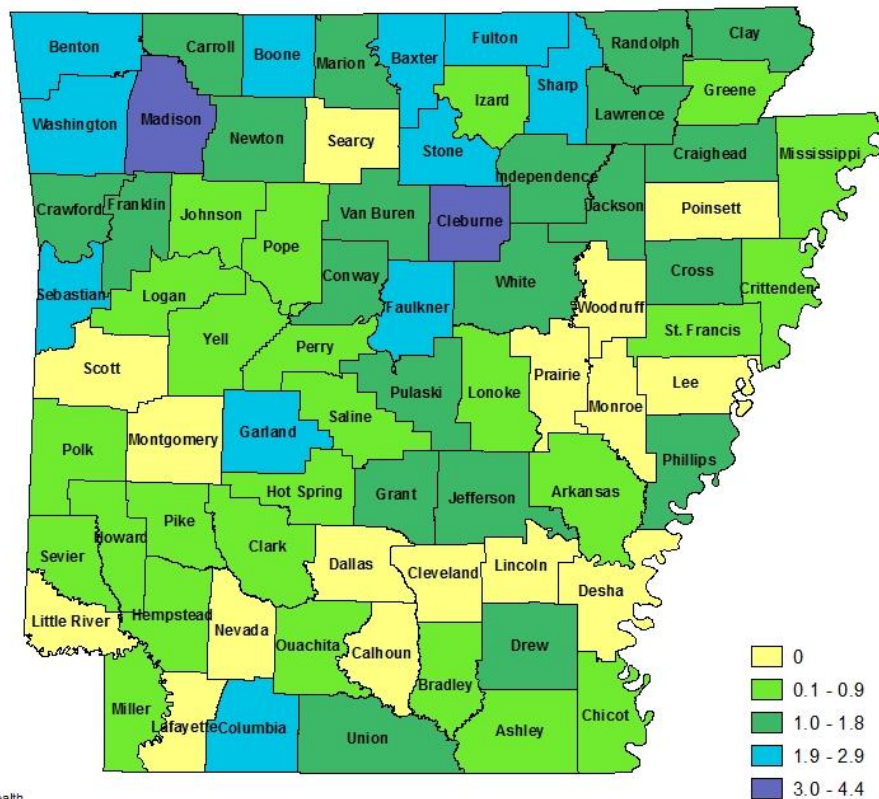

## Chiropractors in Arkansas

In 2012, the Board of Chiropractic Examiners licensed 460 chiropractors with mailing addresses in Arkansas, about 1.6 per 10,000 populations. Of the 75 counties in Arkansas, 16 counties (21%) had no registered chiropractors and 12 other counties (16%) had only one.

### Chiropractors by Counties Per 10,000 Population



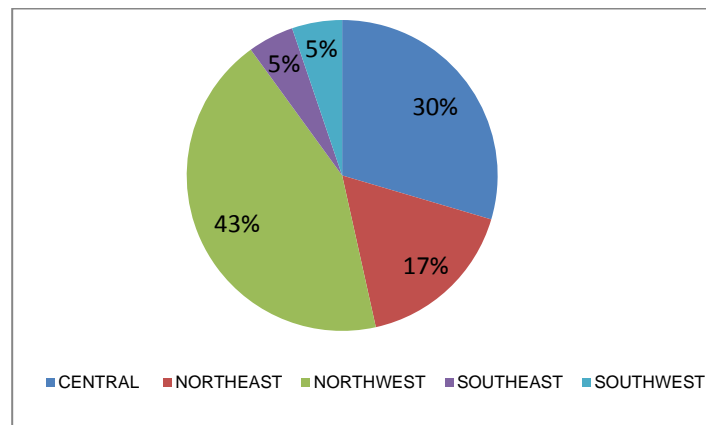

**Chiropractors by Regions**



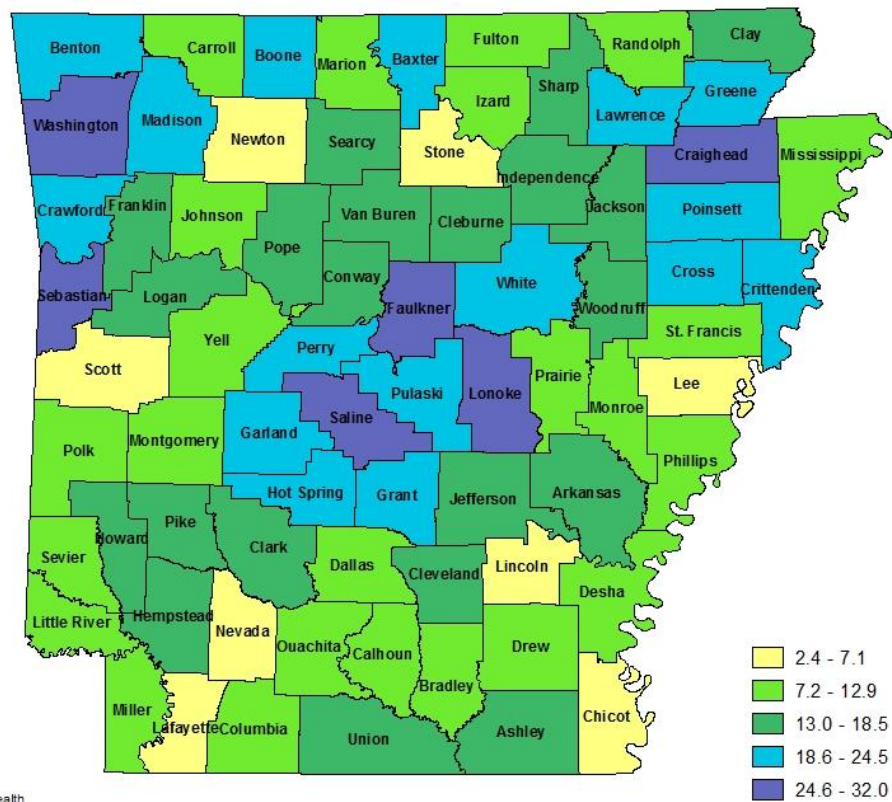

## Dental Health Providers in Arkansas

In 2012, the Board of Dental Examiners licensed 6,042 providers of dental health services with mailing addresses in Arkansas, about 21 per 10,000 populations. This total includes 1,227 dentists (DDS), 3,390 dental assistants (DA), and 1,425 dental hygienists (DH). The number of dental health providers increased by 12% for the state. This percent indicates an increase in DAs by 22%, DHs by 4%, and no increase in percentage of DDSs. Each of the 75 counties in Arkansas had at least two registered dental health providers.

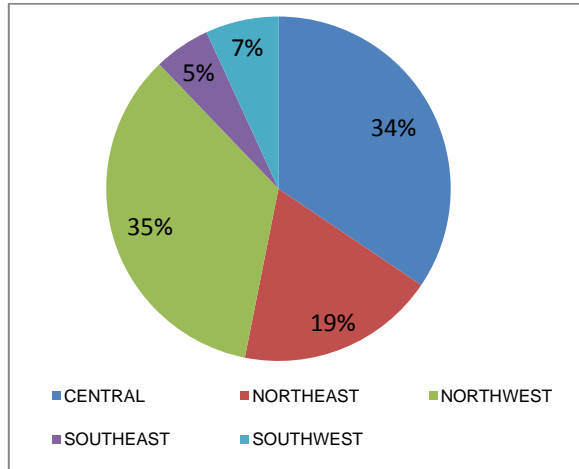
### Dental Health Providers by Counties Per 10,000 Population



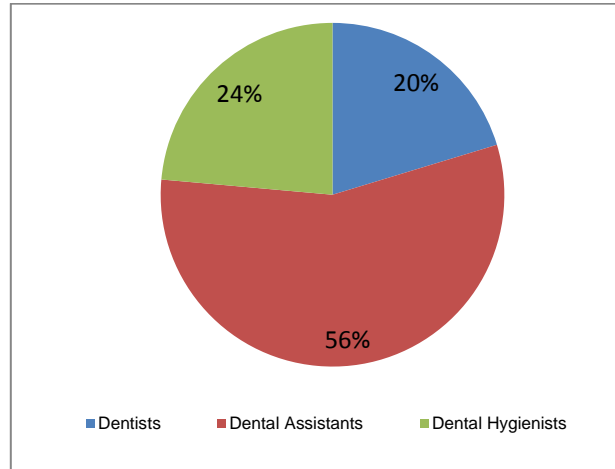

**Distribution of Dental Providers by Specialty**

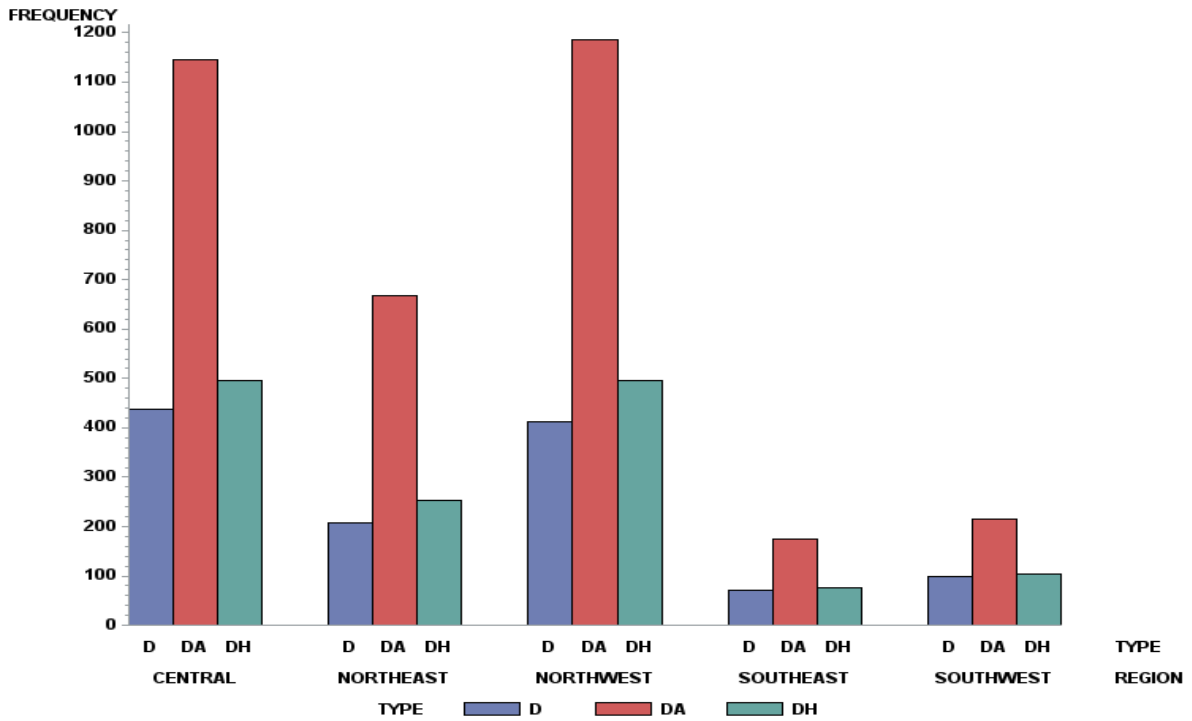

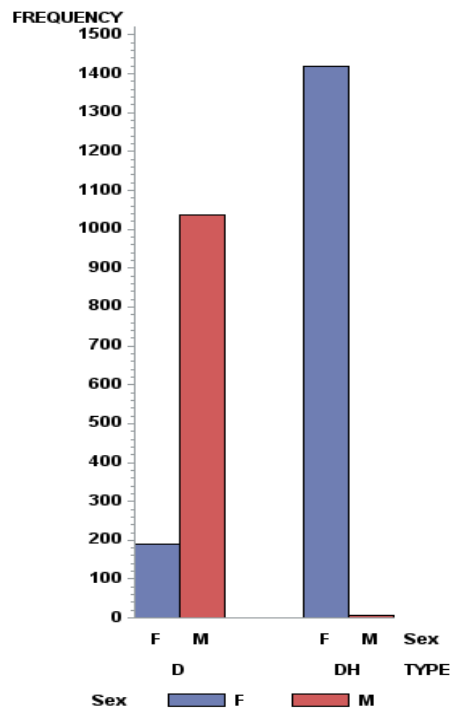

The gender distribution of licensed dentists is heavily skewed towards males (85%) with only (15%) of Arkansas dentists being female, while the gender distribution of licensed dental hygienists is heavily skewed towards females (99%) with only (1%) for males.

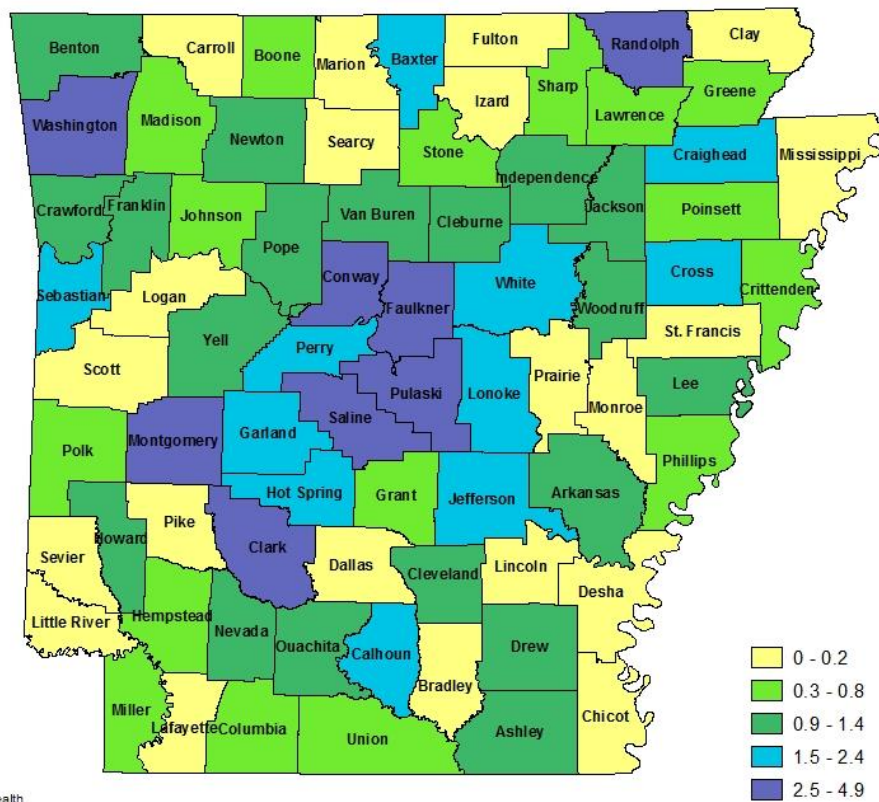

### Dietitians by Counties Per 10,000 Population

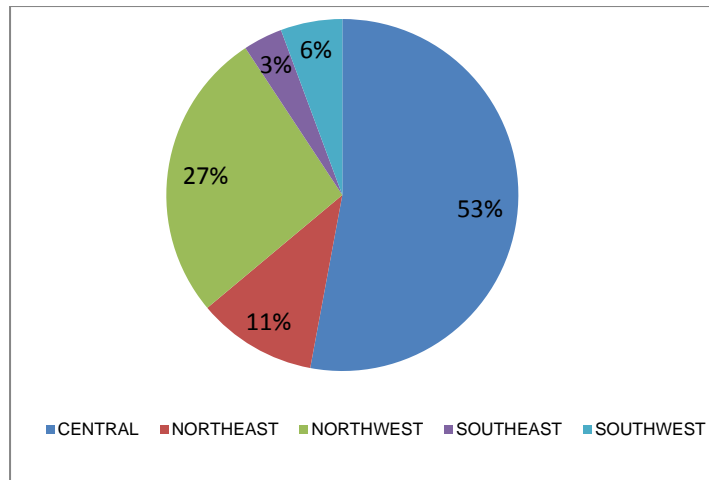

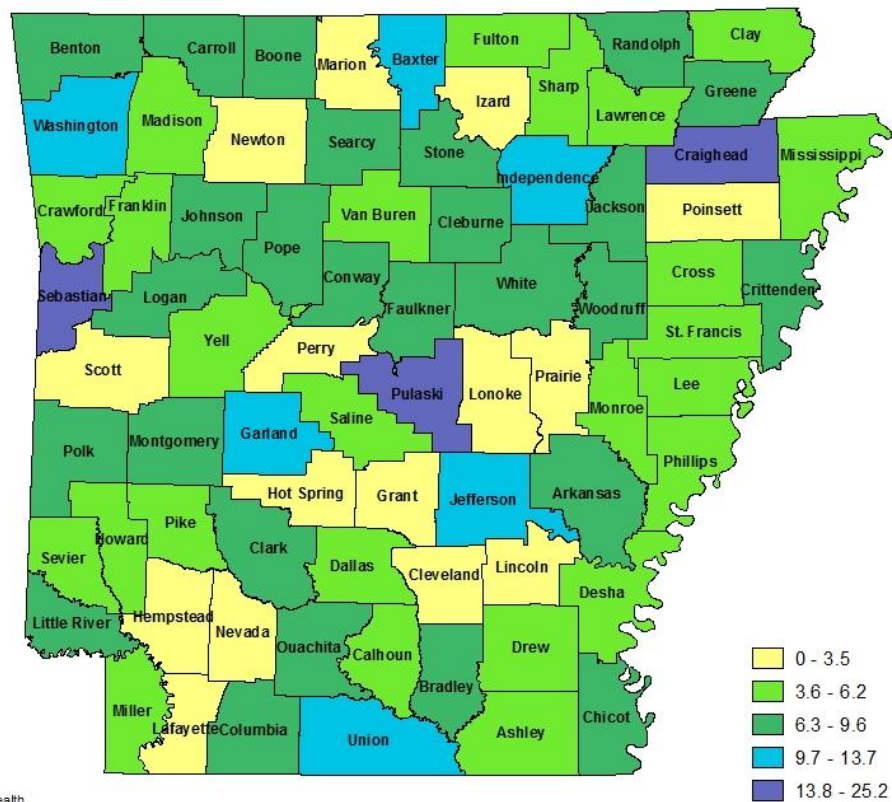

## Medical (Doctors) in Arkansas

In 2012, the Medical Board licensed 9,303 physicians with mailing addresses in Arkansas. The 2012 registry includes 3,160 physicians (34%) registered in five primary care specialties with mailing addresses in Arkansas, about 11 per 10,000 population. This list includes: 1,351 family practice, 97 general practice, 898 internal medicine, 295 obstetrics-gynecologists (OB/GYN), and 519 pediatrics. At least one fully licensed primary care specialist was registered in each Arkansas County with the exception of Cleveland County. The board licensed 3,261 physicians registered as Health Related Professions, this total includes 1,678 Respiratory Therapists (LRCP), 1,111 Occupational Therapy (OT), 274 Occupational Therapy Assistants (OT-A), 191 Physician Assistants (PA), 3 Radiology (RA) and 4 Radiology Assistants (RPA). The board licensed 2,830 physicians as secondary specialists and 52 physicians who reported no specialty.

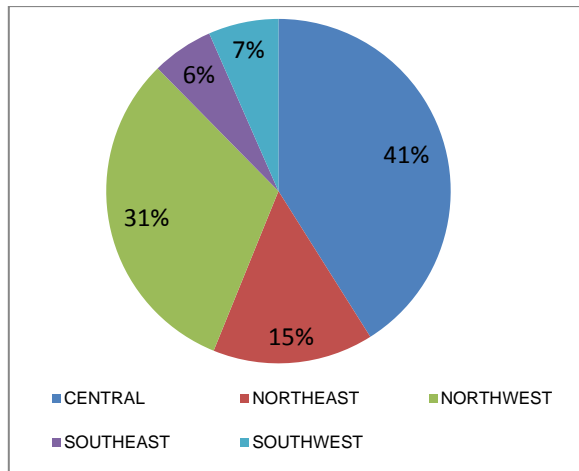
### Primary Care Physicians by Counties Per 10,000 Population



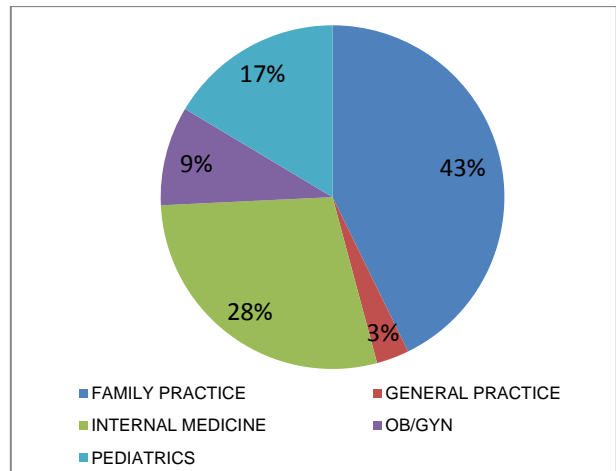

**Distribution of Primary Care Physicians by Specialty**

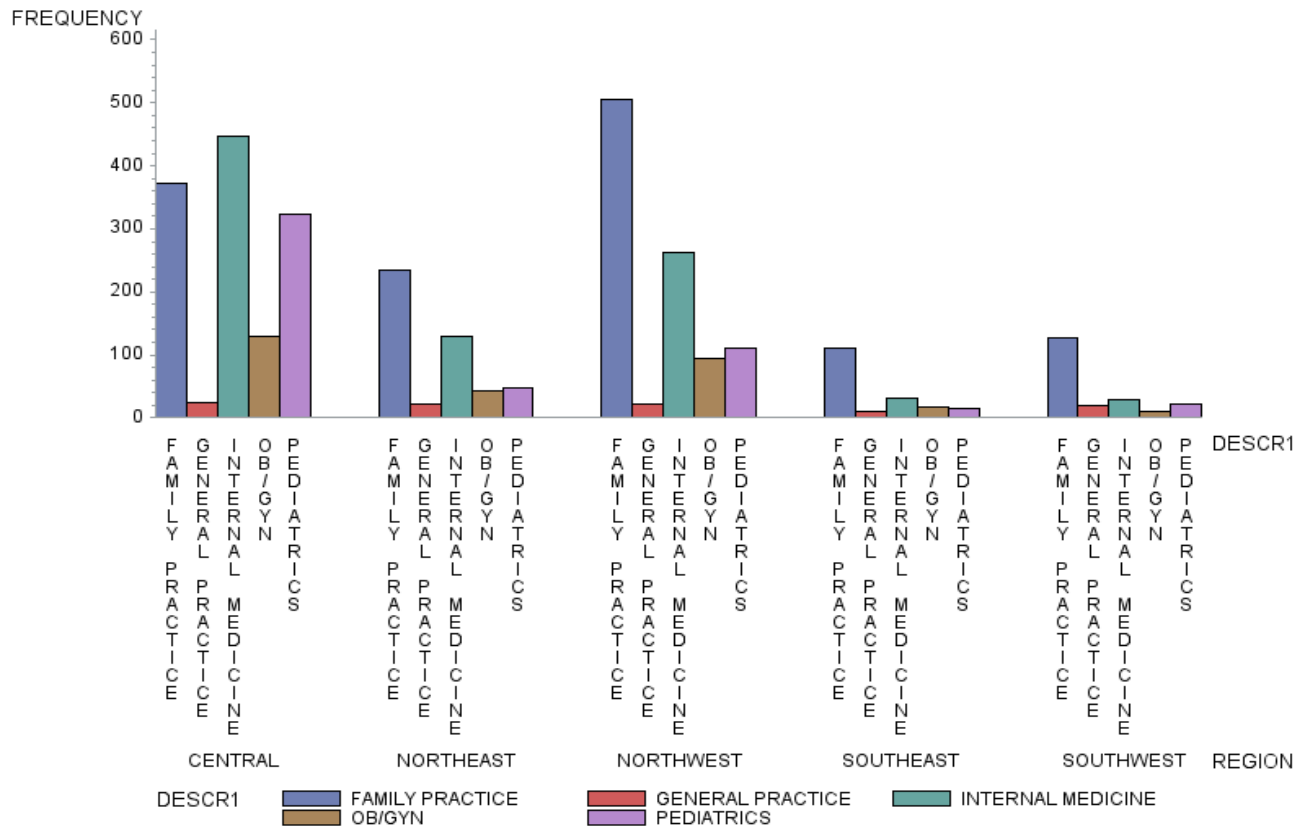

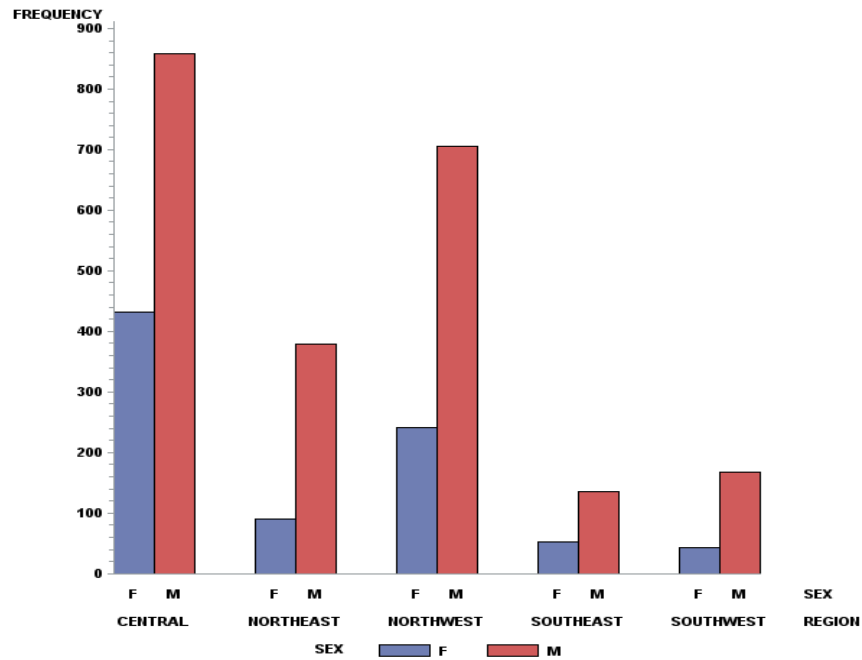

Primary Care Physicians by Regions and Specialty

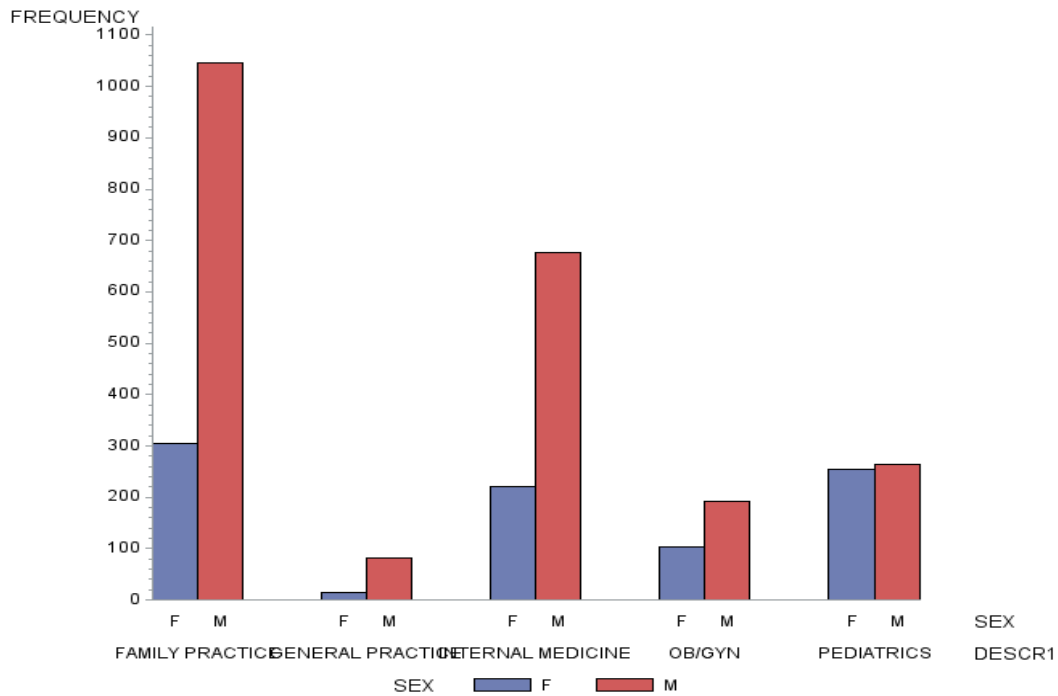




The gender distribution of licensed primary care physicians is heavily skewed toward males (72%), with only (28%) of licensed primary care physicians being females.



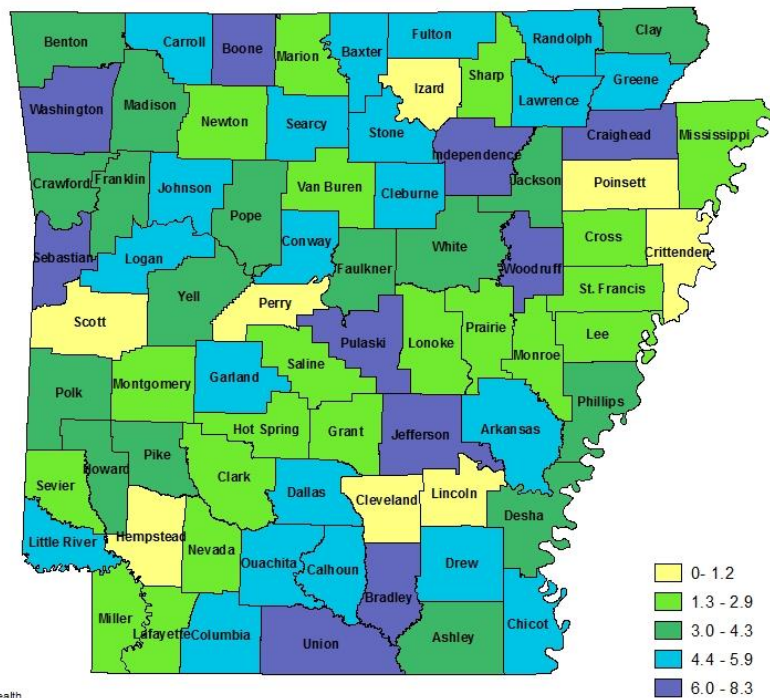

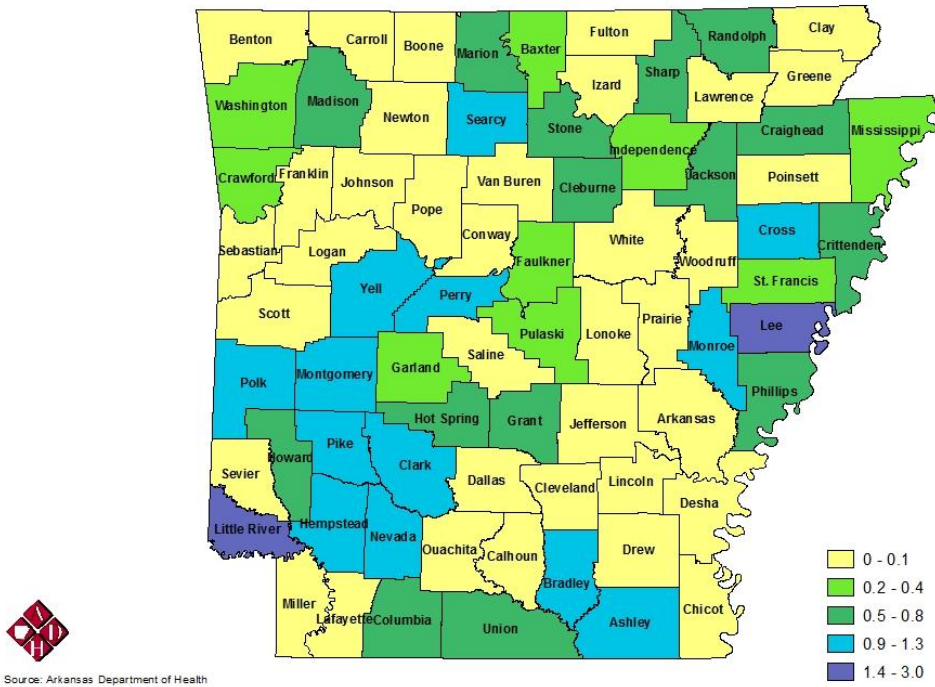

**Family Practice Physicians by Counties Per 10,000 Population**

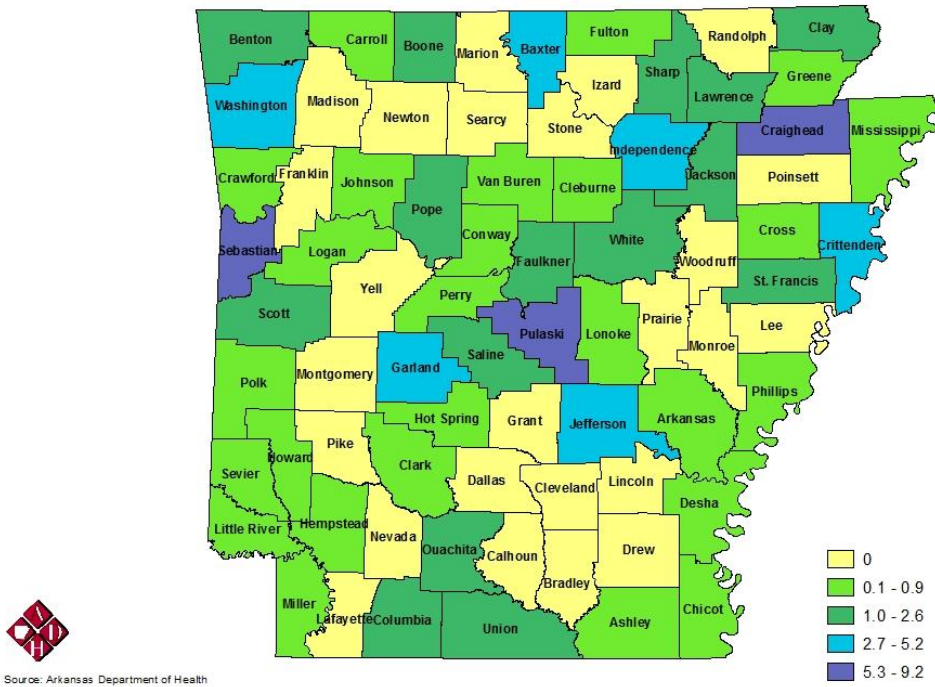

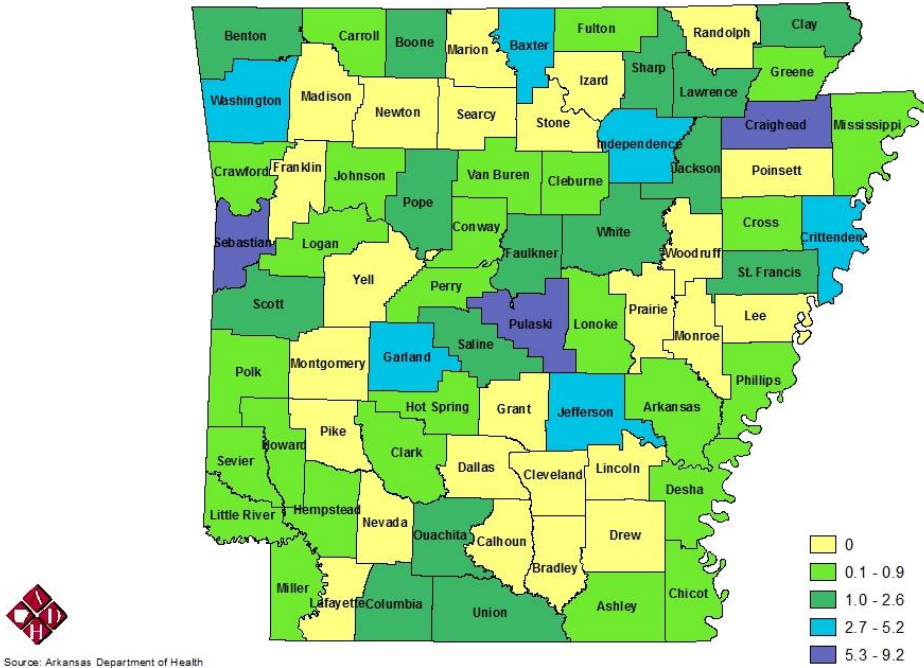
## General Practice Physicians by Counties Per 10,000 Population



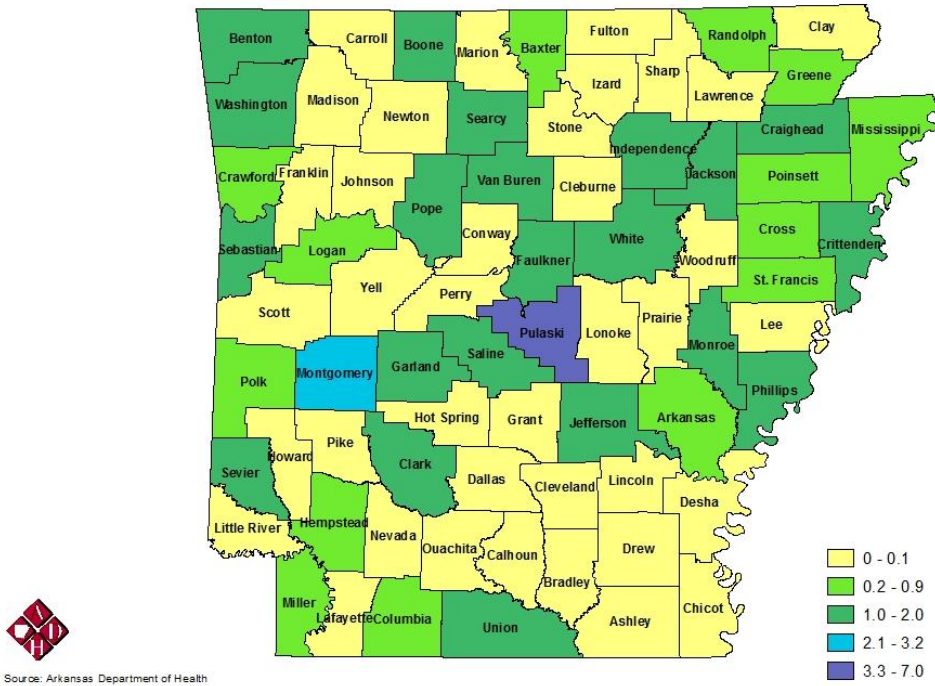
## Internal Medicine Physicians by Counties Per 10,000 Population

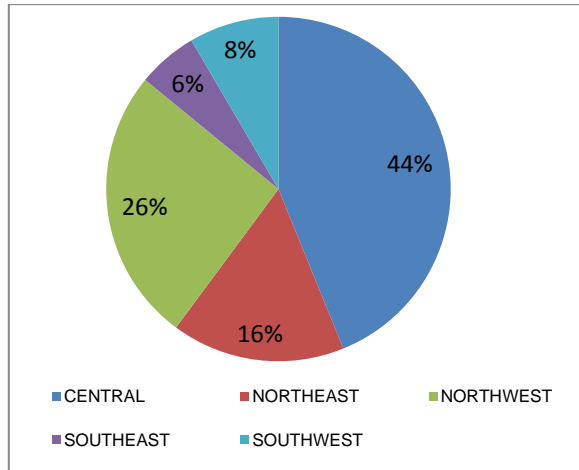

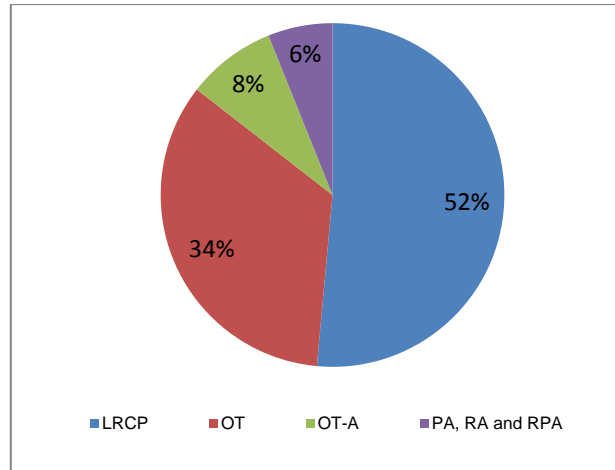

**Health Related Professionals by Region**



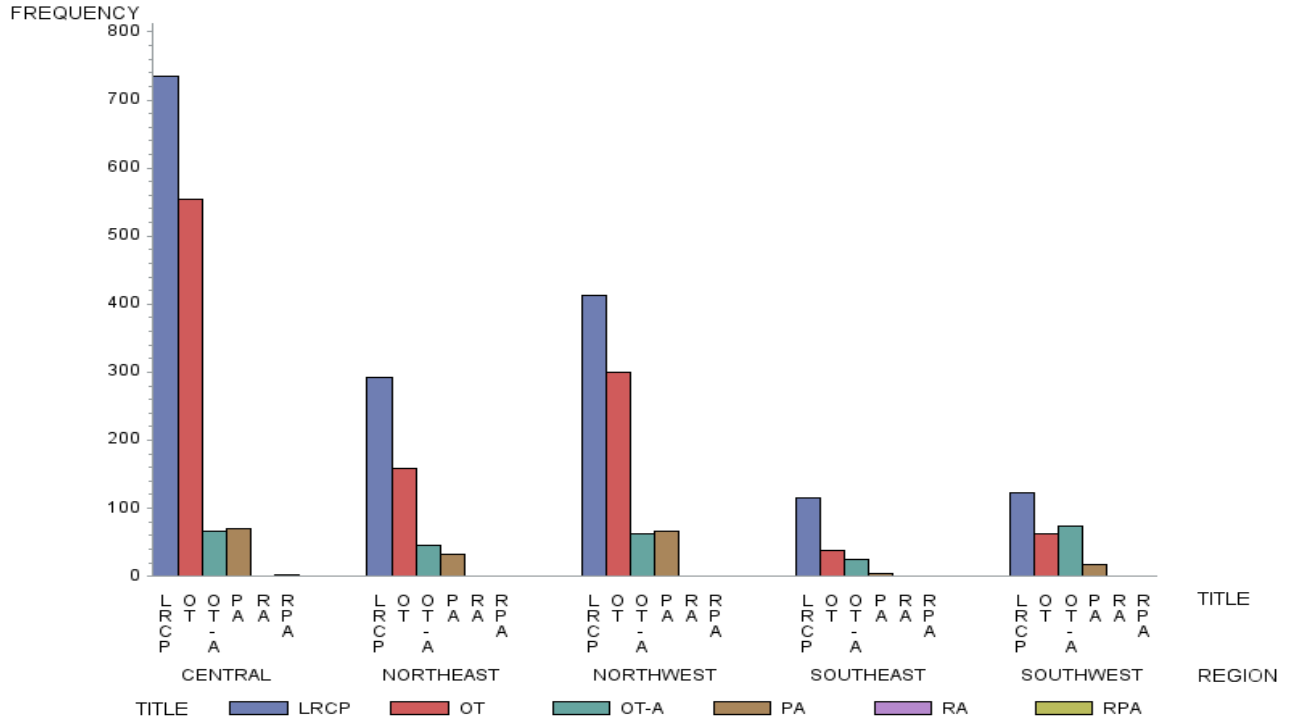

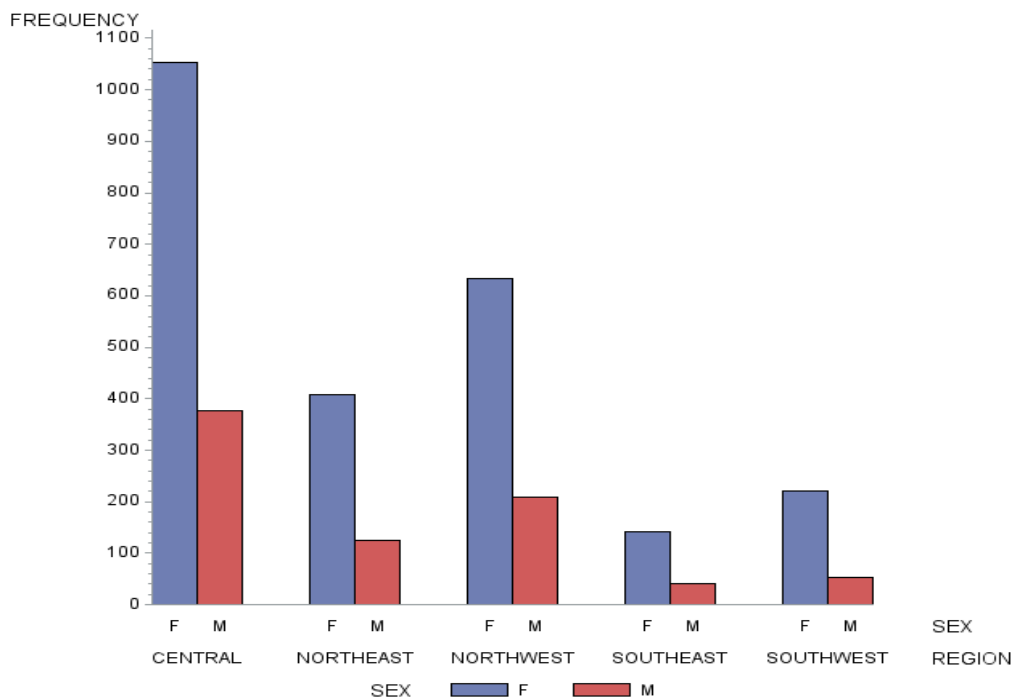

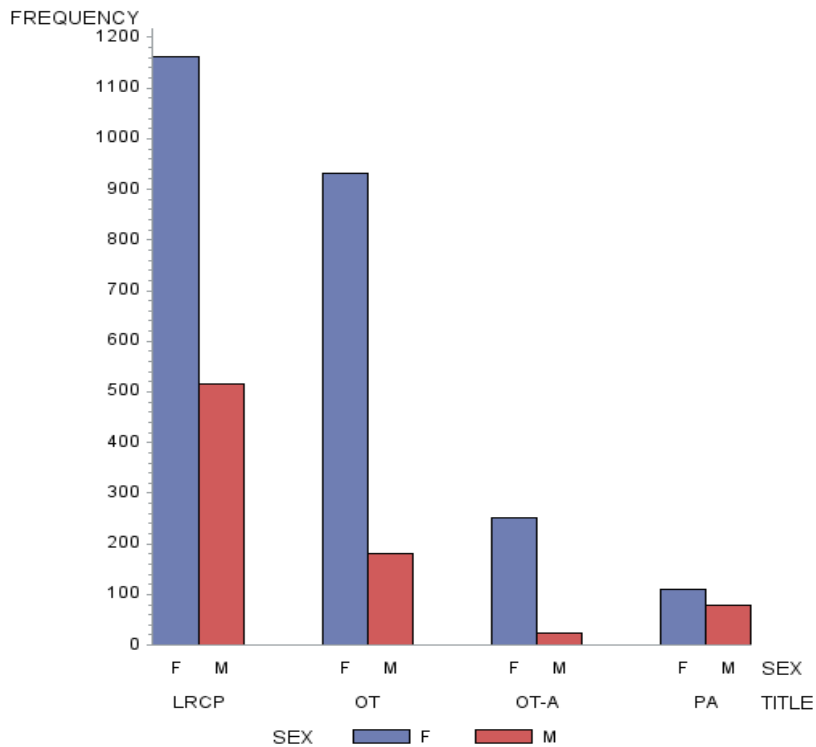
## Health Related Professionals by Regions and Specialty

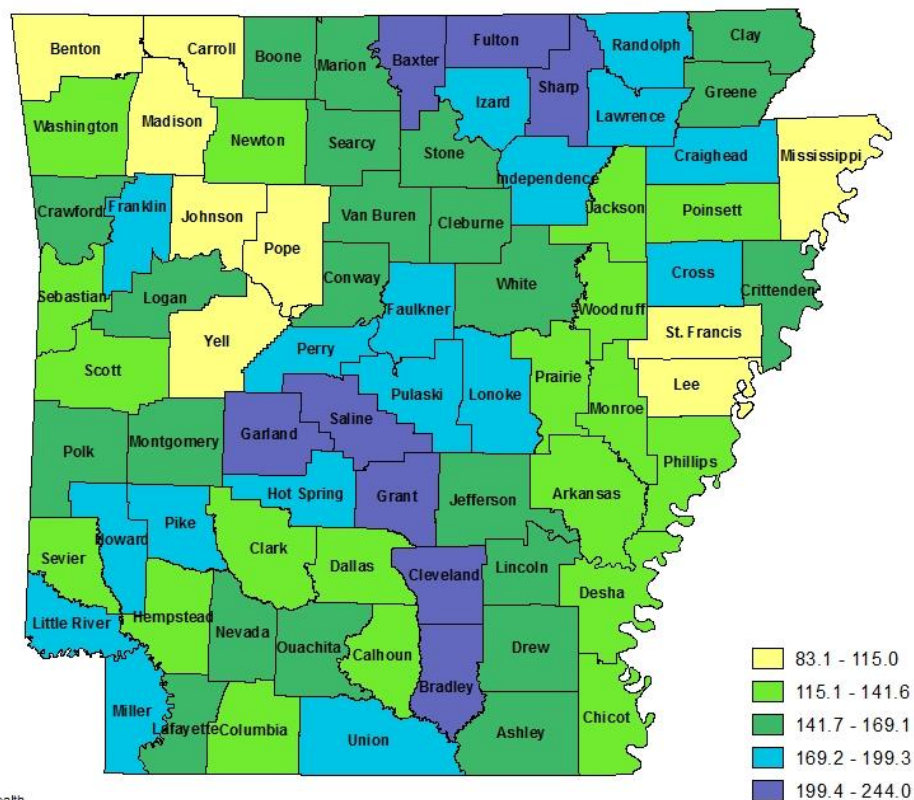

## Nurses in Arkansas

In 2012, the Nursing Board licensed 47,451 nurses with mailing addresses in Arkansas, about 161 per 10,000 populations. These 47,451 nurses had a total of 50,570 licenses but for the purposes of this report we used the following hierarchy to take the highest of the five license types: LPN < LPTN < RN < RNP < APN. The APNs consist of 4 different licenses but will be grouped together for the majority of this section. They will be broken down into individual licenses later in the section. The number of licensed nurses for the state increased 1.3% from 2011 to 2012. This total includes 30,700 Registered Nurses (RN), 14,331 Licensed Practical Nurses (LPN), 124 Licensed Psychiatric Technician Nurses (LPTN), and 441 Registered Nurse Practitioners (RNP). There were 1,855 nurses registered as Advanced Practice Nurses (APN).

*After completing basic nursing programs, RNs and LPNs must pass nationally standardized examinations. LPTNs must have passed a state licensure exam. RNPs have completed a nurse practitioner program in addition to their RN program. To be licensed as an APN, an RN must complete an advanced practice nursing program and hold certification from a Board approved, nationally recognized, certifying body.*

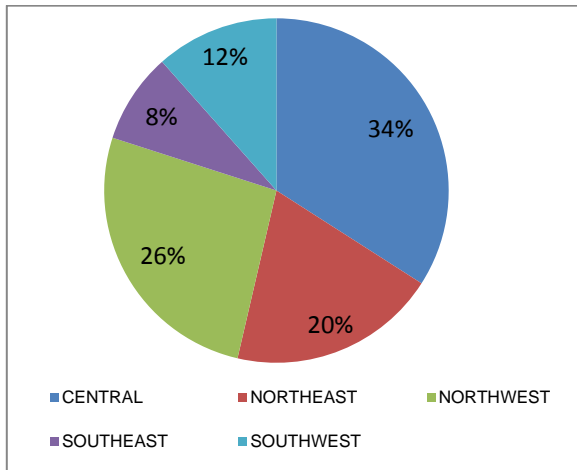
**Nurses by Counties Per 10,000 Population**



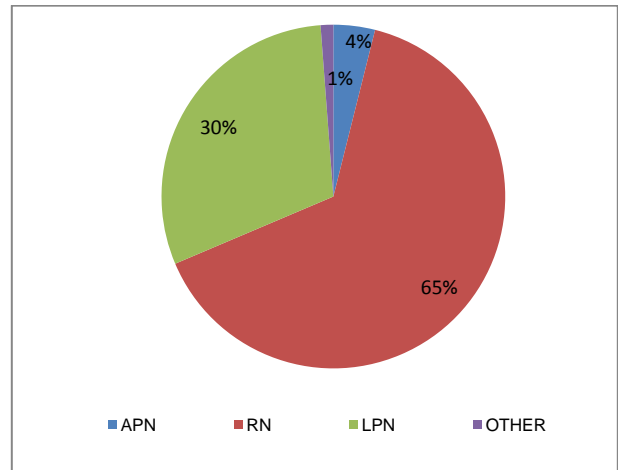

**Distribution of Nurses by Title**

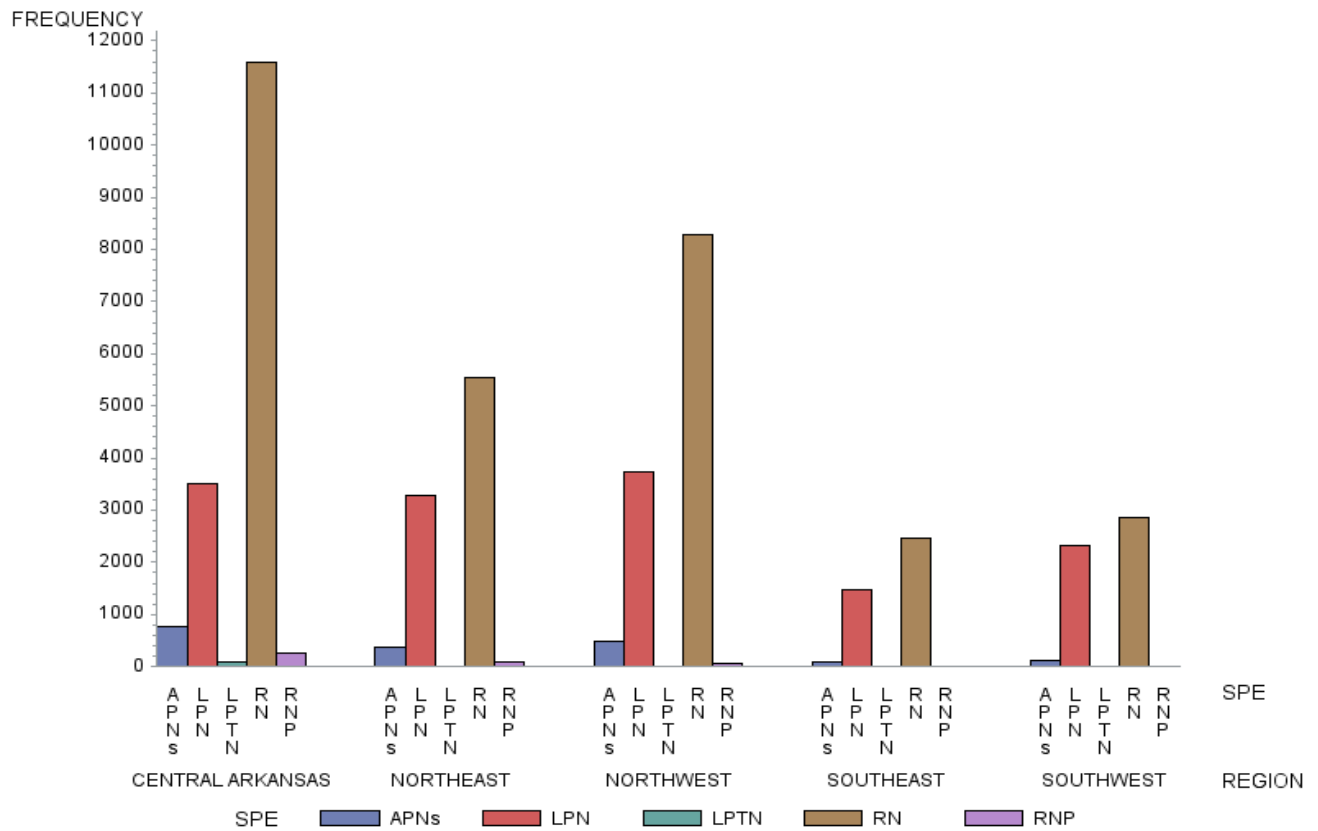

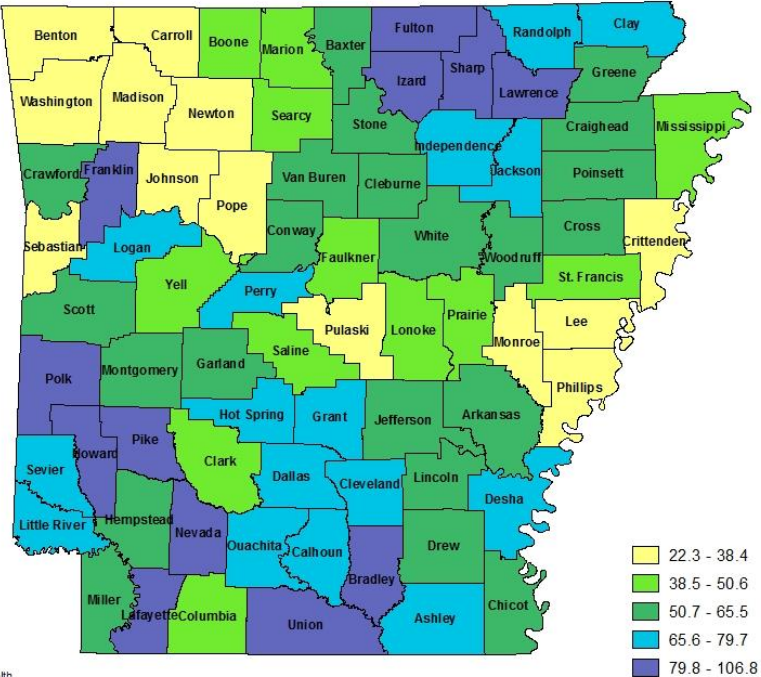

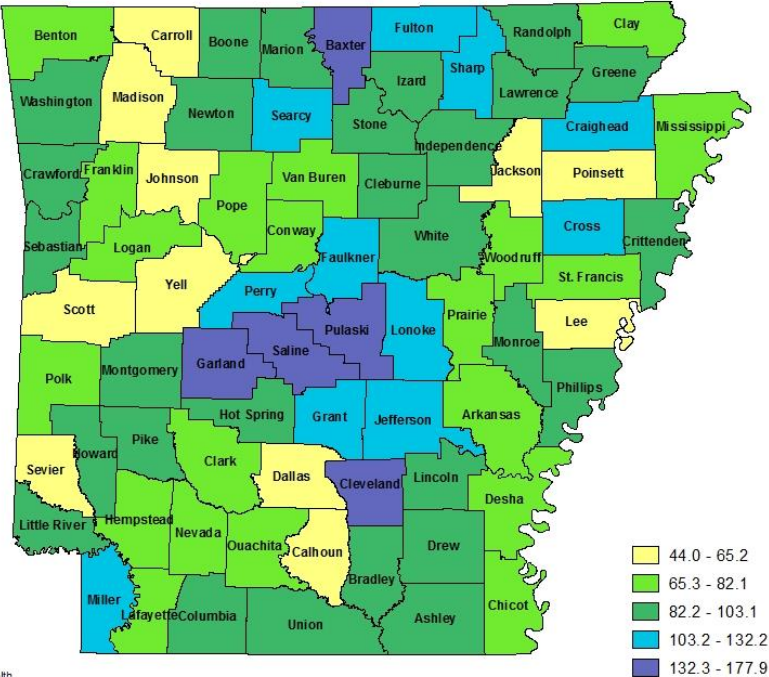


### Licensed Practical Nurses Per 10,000 Population

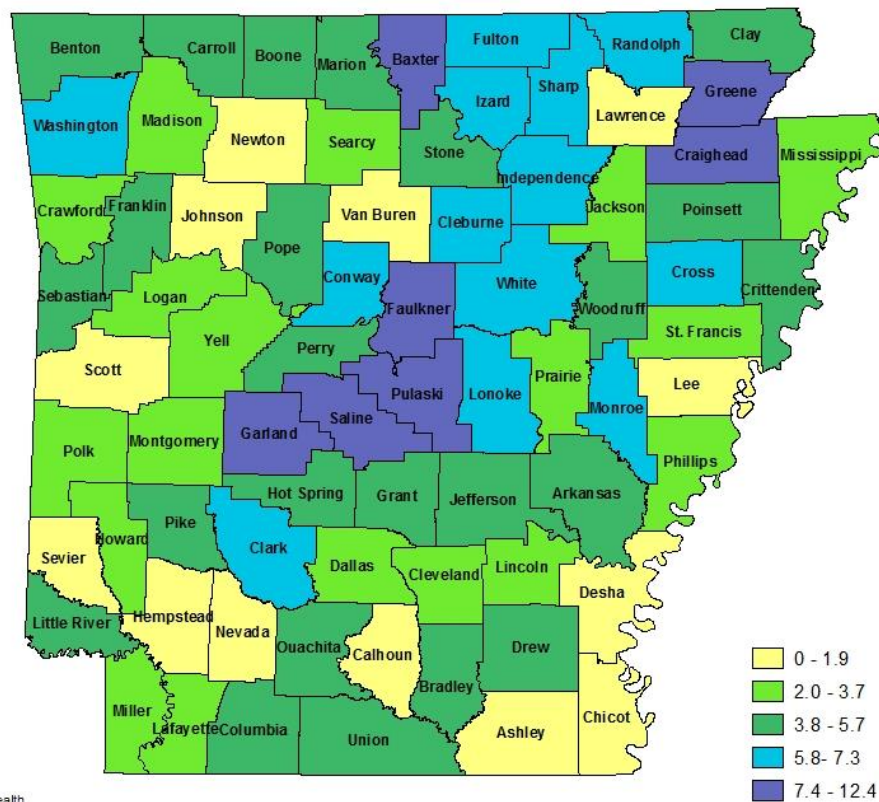

At this point in the section we will look at the Advanced Practice Nurse group and break it down into the individual license types. The four licenses in this category: Certified Nurse Midwife (CNM), Clinical Nurse Specialist (CNS), Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CNRA), and Certified Nurse Practitioner (CNP). Certified Nurse Practitioner has replaced the term Advanced Nurse Practitioner (ANP). These four licenses are considered equal in educational requirements so there is not a hierarchy for this group. Since they are considered equal, the nurses that have more than one APN license will be counted in the analysis for each license they have.

There are 1,855 Advanced Practice Nurses with a total of 1,872 licenses. This total includes 1,281 Certified Nurse Practitioners (CNP), 23 Certified Nurse Midwives (CNM), 130 Clinical Nurse Specialists (CNS), and 438 Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetists (CRNA).

### Advanced Practice Nurses by Counties Per 10,000 Population

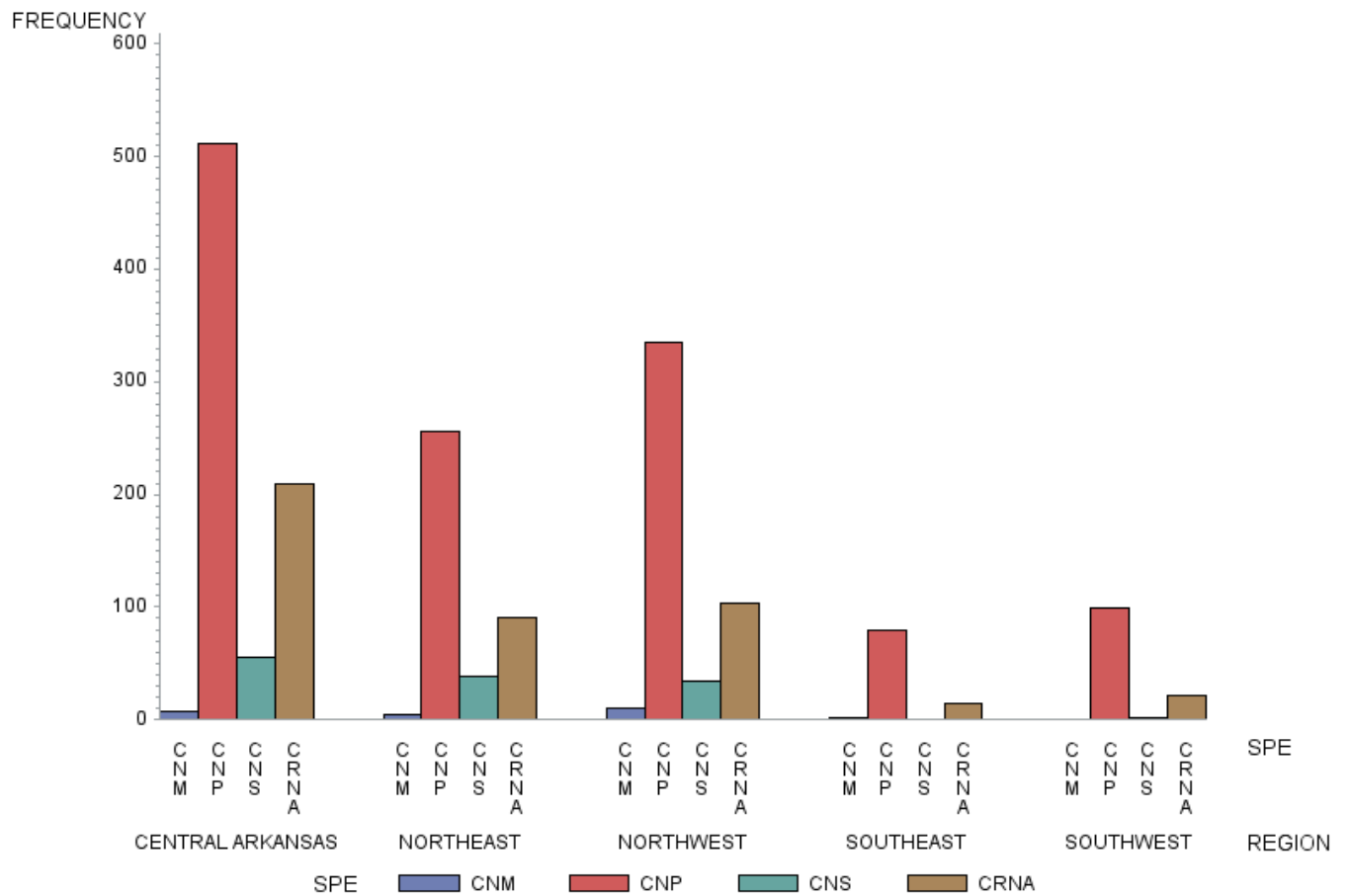

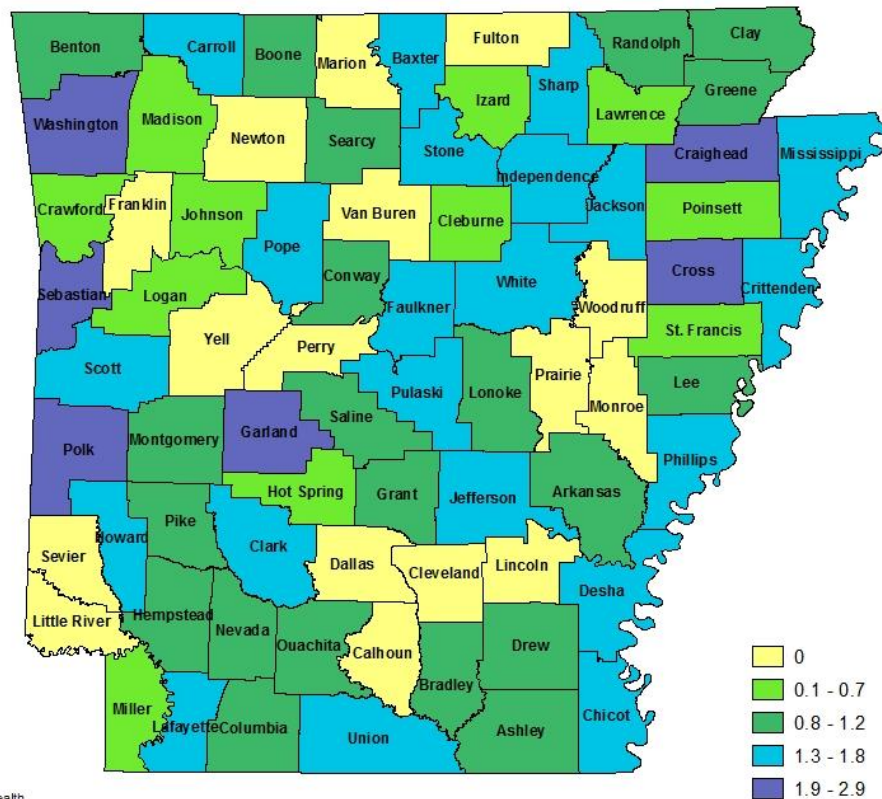

### Optometrists by Counties Per 10,000 Population

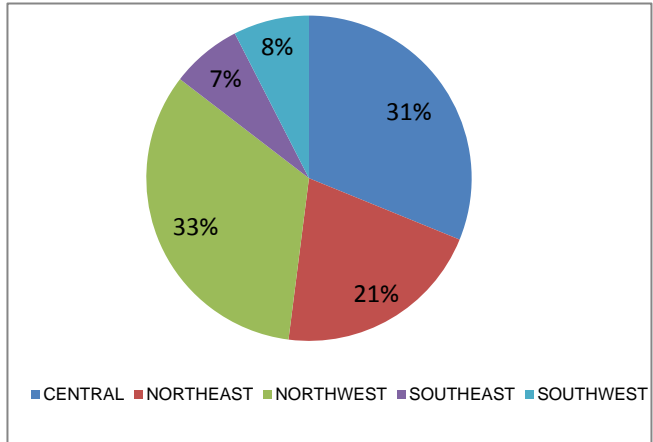

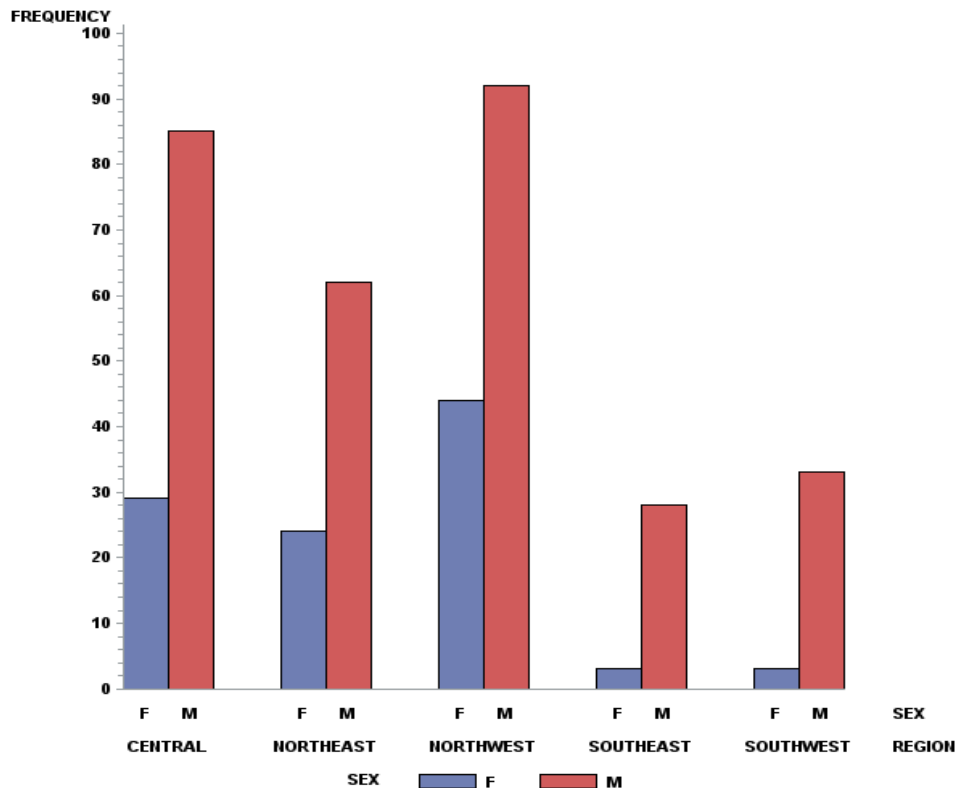

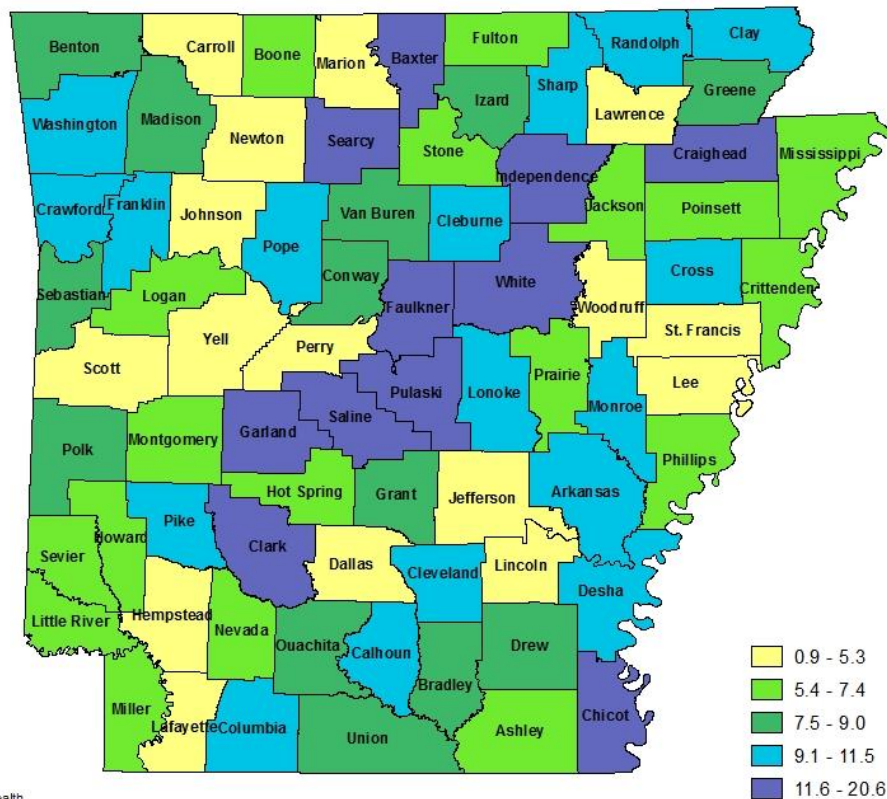

### Pharmacists by Counties Per 10,000 Population

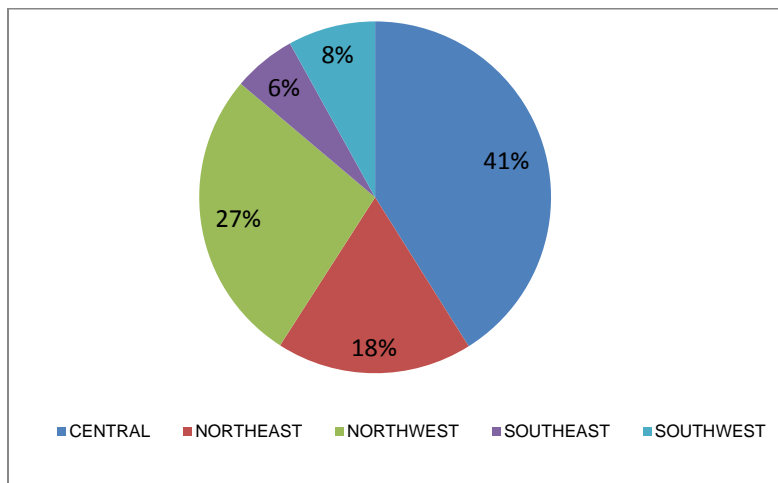

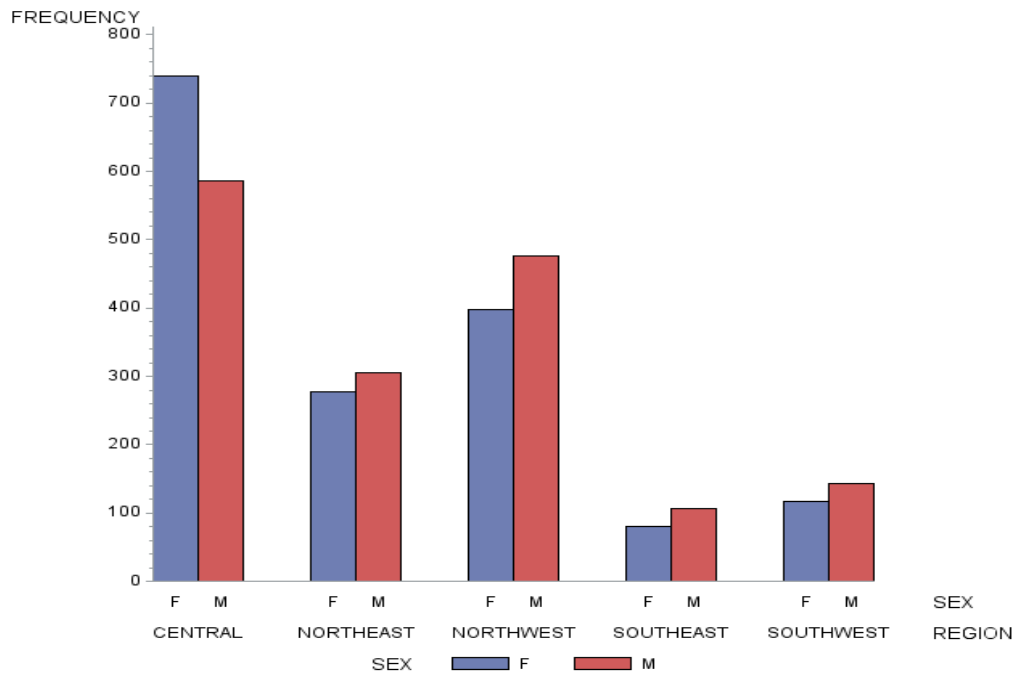

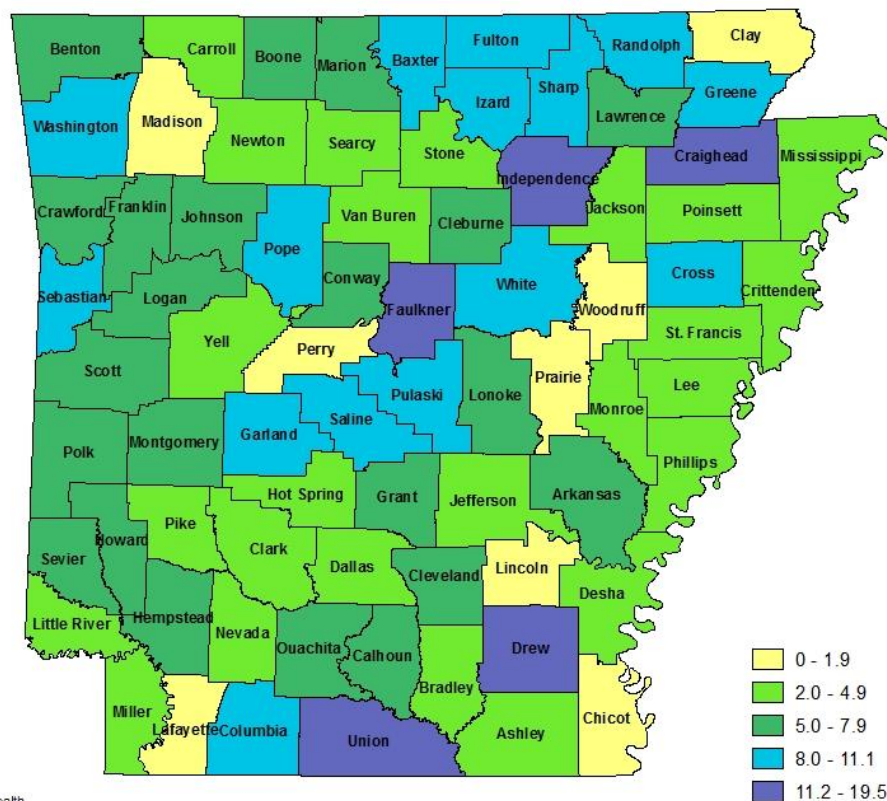

### Physical Therapists by Counties Per 10,000 Population

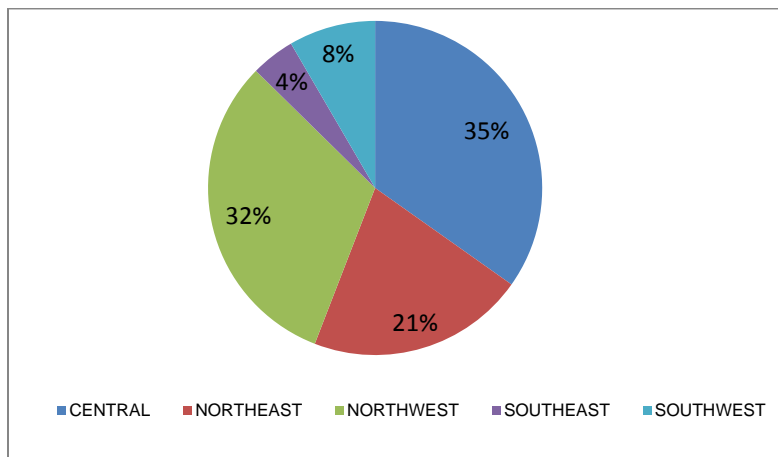


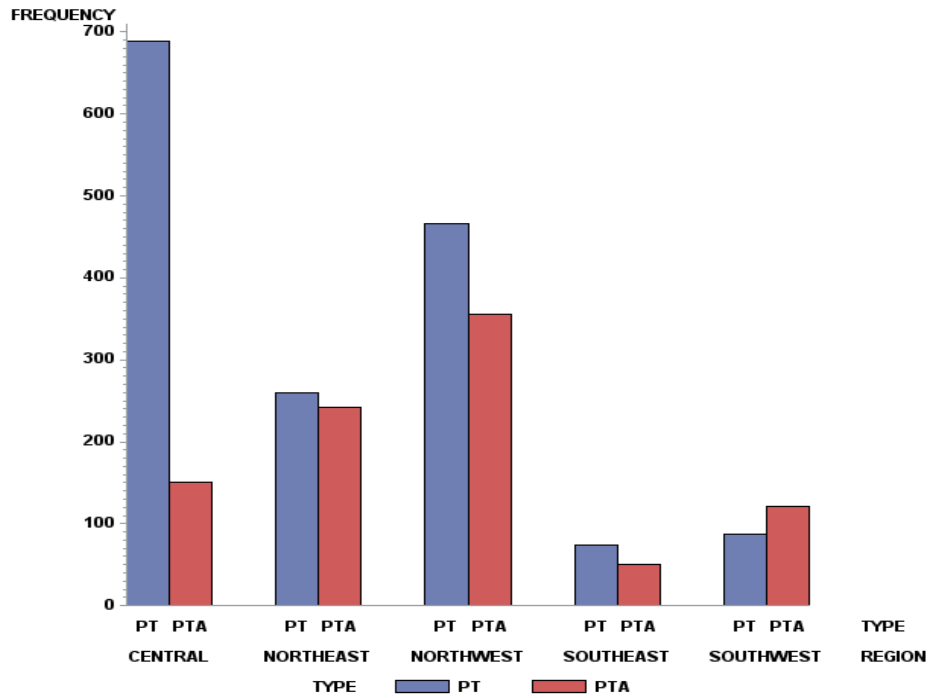

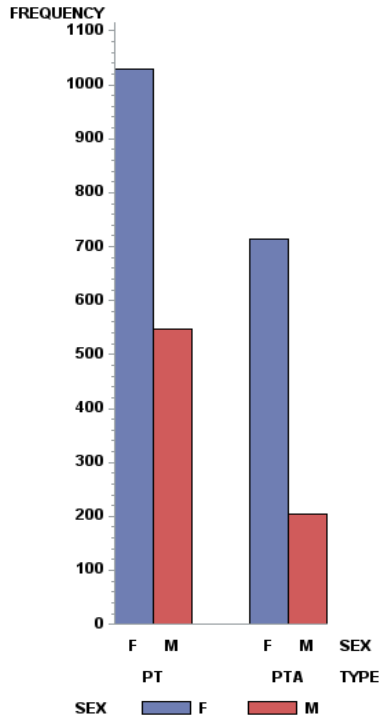
**Physical Therapists by Regions**

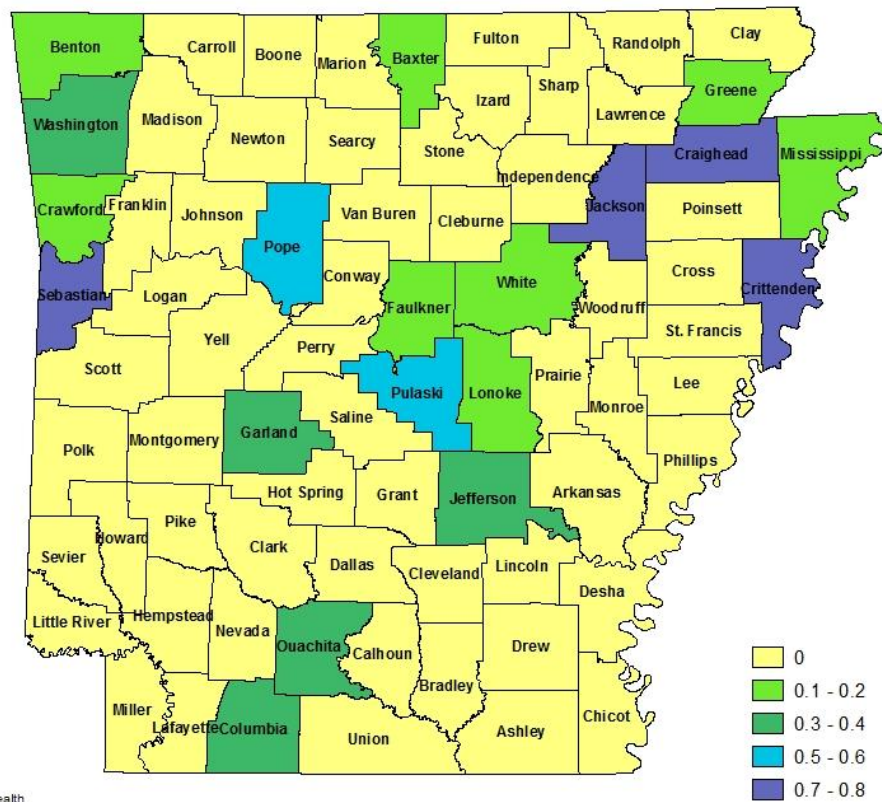

### Podiatrists by Counties Per 10,000 Population

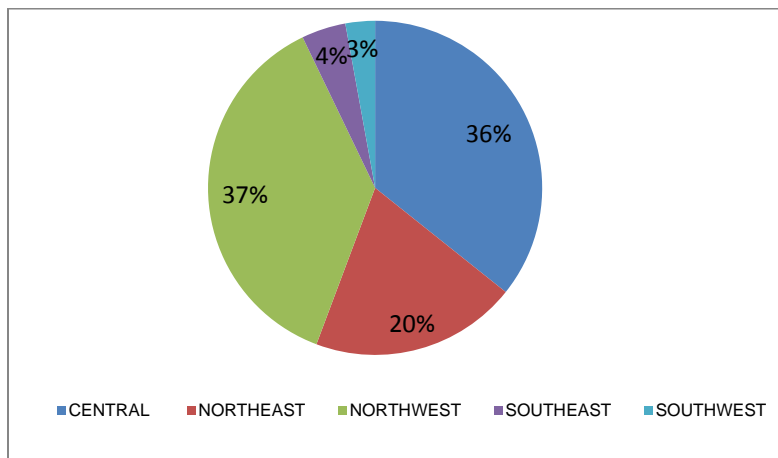




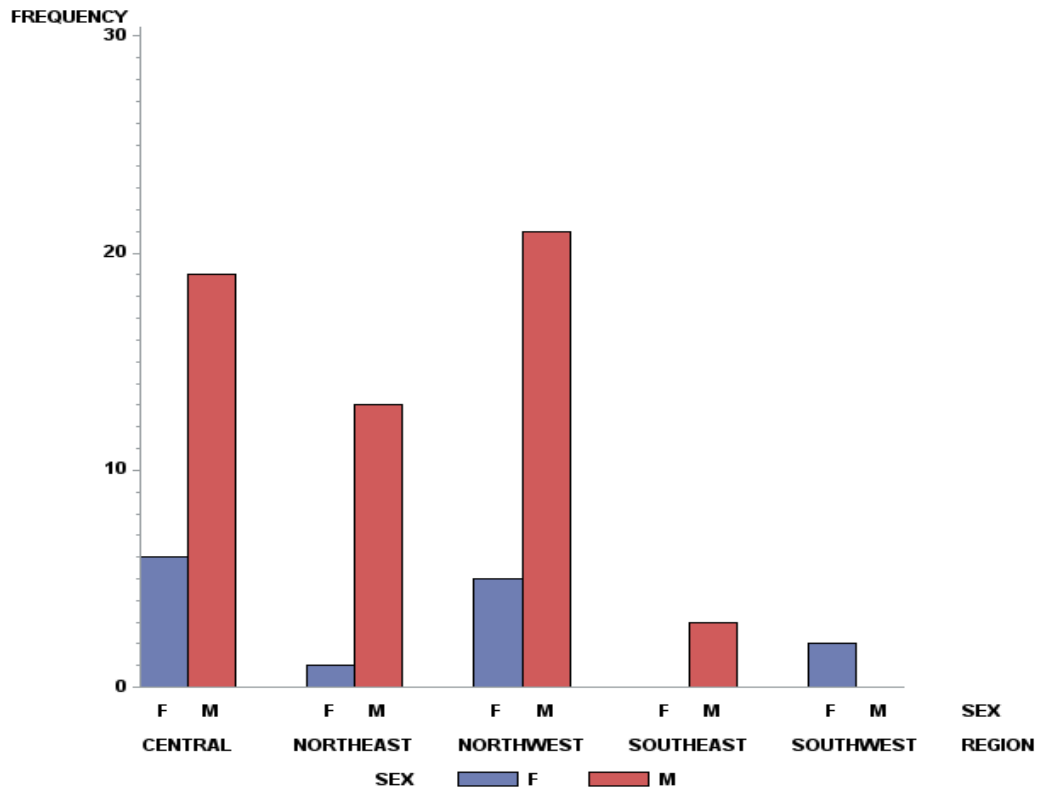

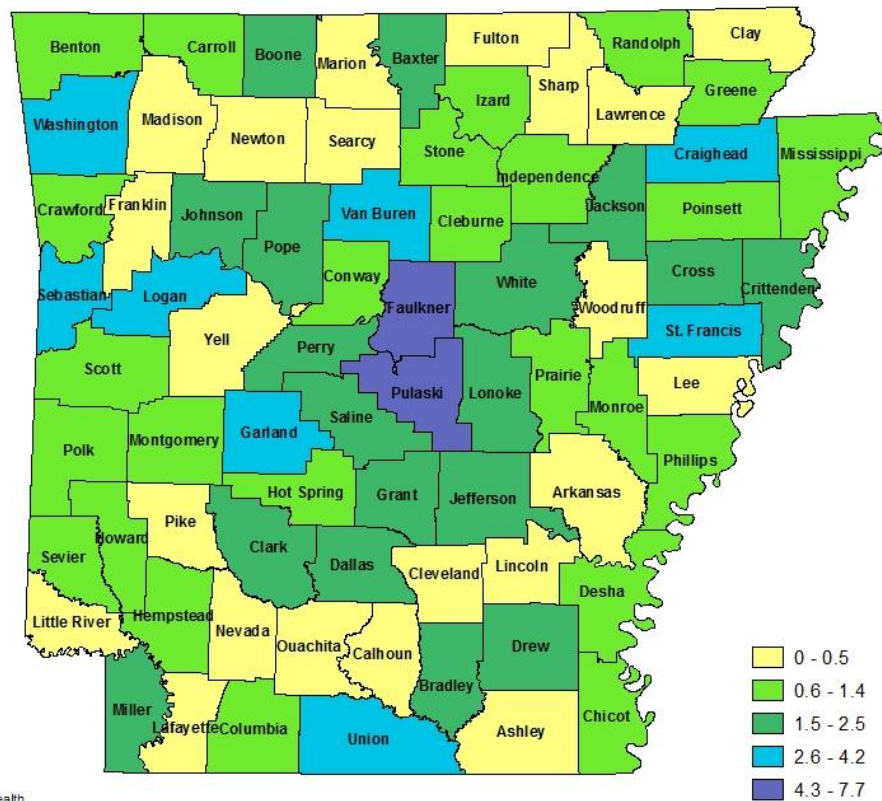

## Psychology Examiners in Arkansas

In 2012, the Psychology Board licensed 829 psychologists with mailing addresses in Arkansas, about 2.8 per 10,000 populations. This total includes 445 Psychologists (P), 173 Psychologists Examiners (E), and 211 Psychological Examiner Independents (EI); about 1.5, 0.6 and 0.7 respectively, per 10,000 population. Of the 75 Arkansas counties, 19 (25%) did not have a registered psychologist and 11 (15%) of the counties had only one.

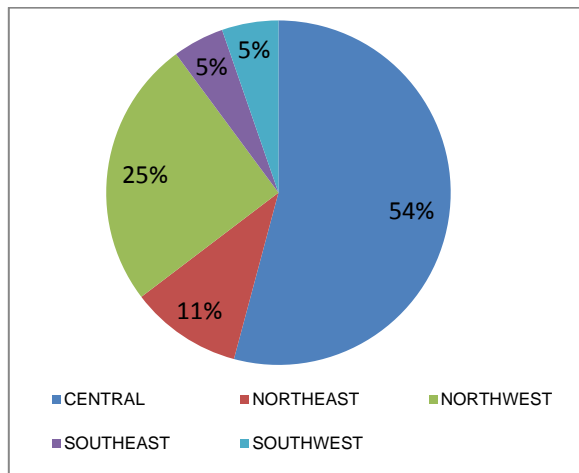
### Psychologists by Counties Per 10,000 Population



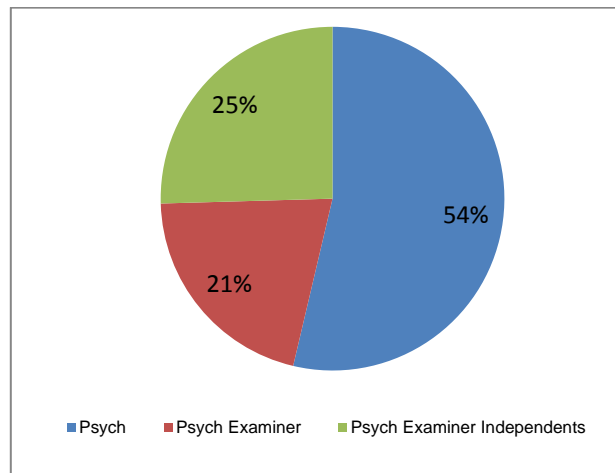

**Distribution of Psychologists by Title**

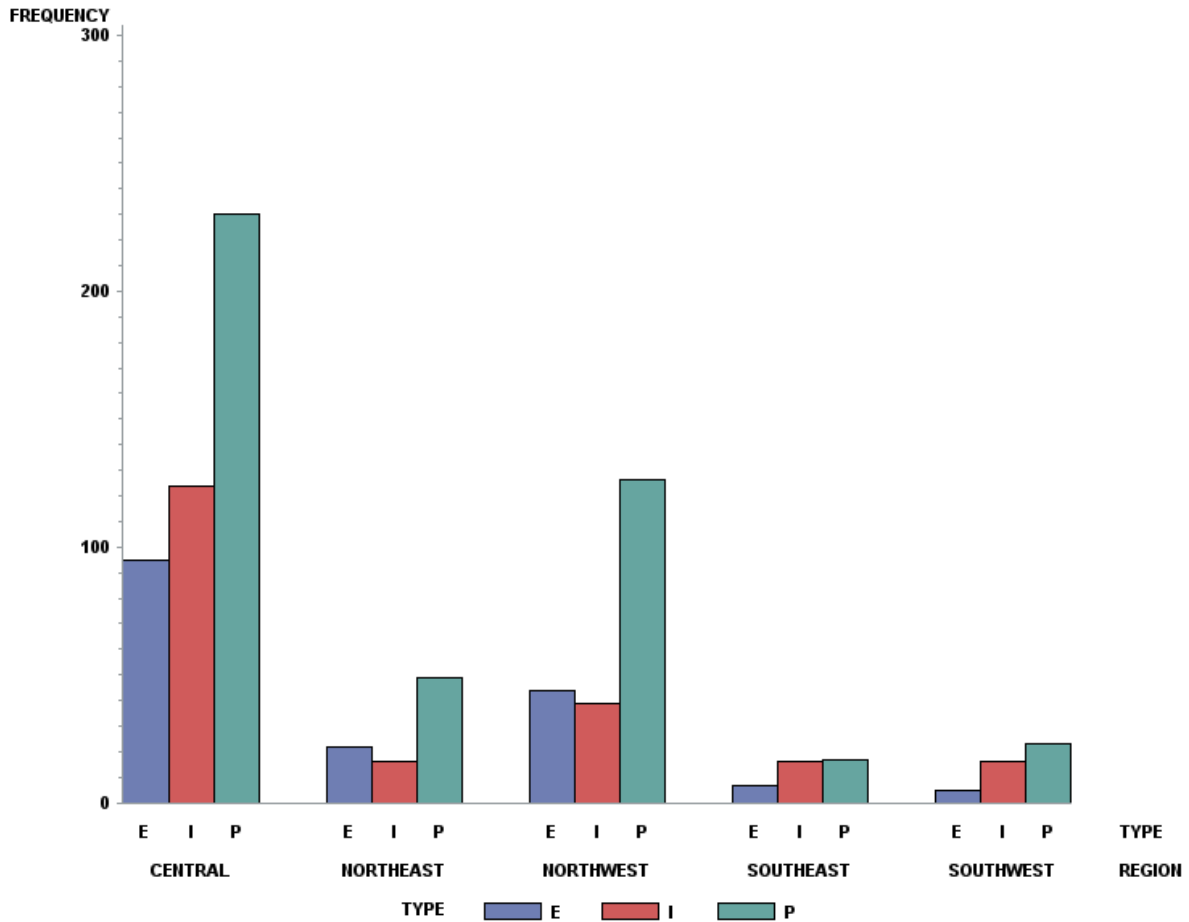

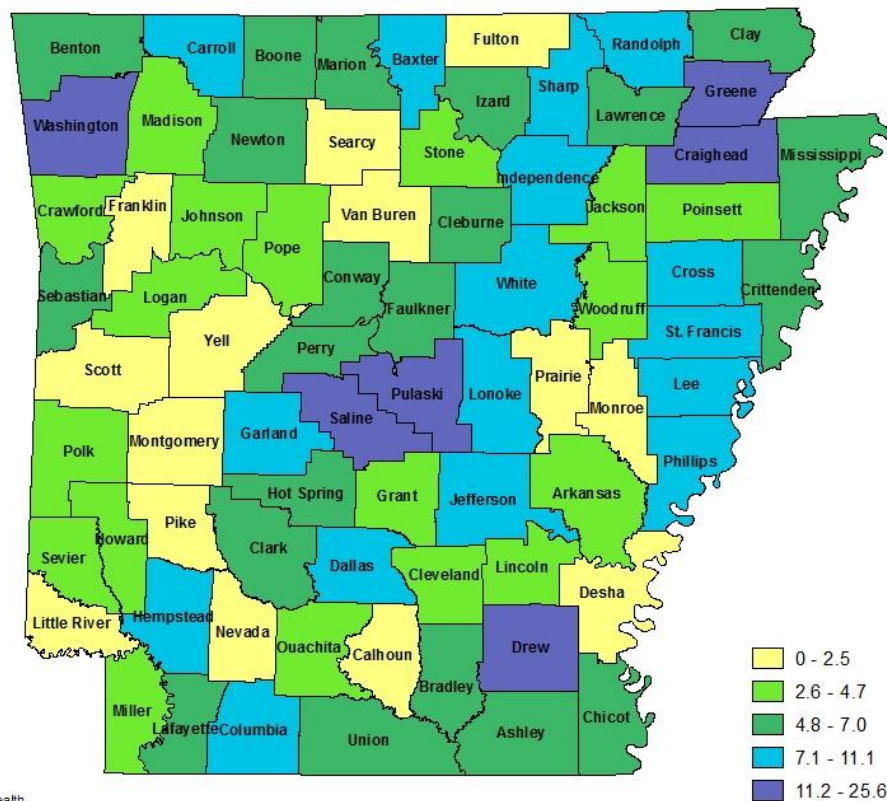

## Social Workers in Arkansas

In 2012, the Social Work Licensing Board licensed 3,063 social workers with mailing addresses in Arkansas about 10 per 10,000 populations. This total includes 618 social workers (LSW), 1,459 certified social workers (LCSW), and 824 master social workers (LMSW). In addition, the Social Worker Licensing Board issued 162 provisional licenses for social workers with mailing addresses in Arkansas (*provisional license for social workers means: First-time applicants for LSW or LMSW licensure will be issued a provisional license upon approval of his or her application. A provisional license will be issued one time per person and will expire exactly one-year from the date of issuance. Provisional licensing is prohibited at the LCSW level.*). This total includes 99 Provisional license social workers (PLSW), and 63 provisional license master social workers (PLMSW). At least one fully licensed social worker was licensed in each of the Arkansas counties with the exception of Calhoun and Little River counties.

### Social Workers by Counties Per 10,000 Population

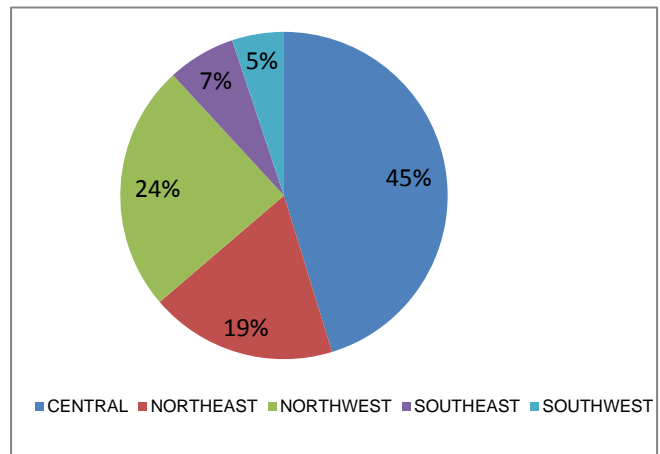

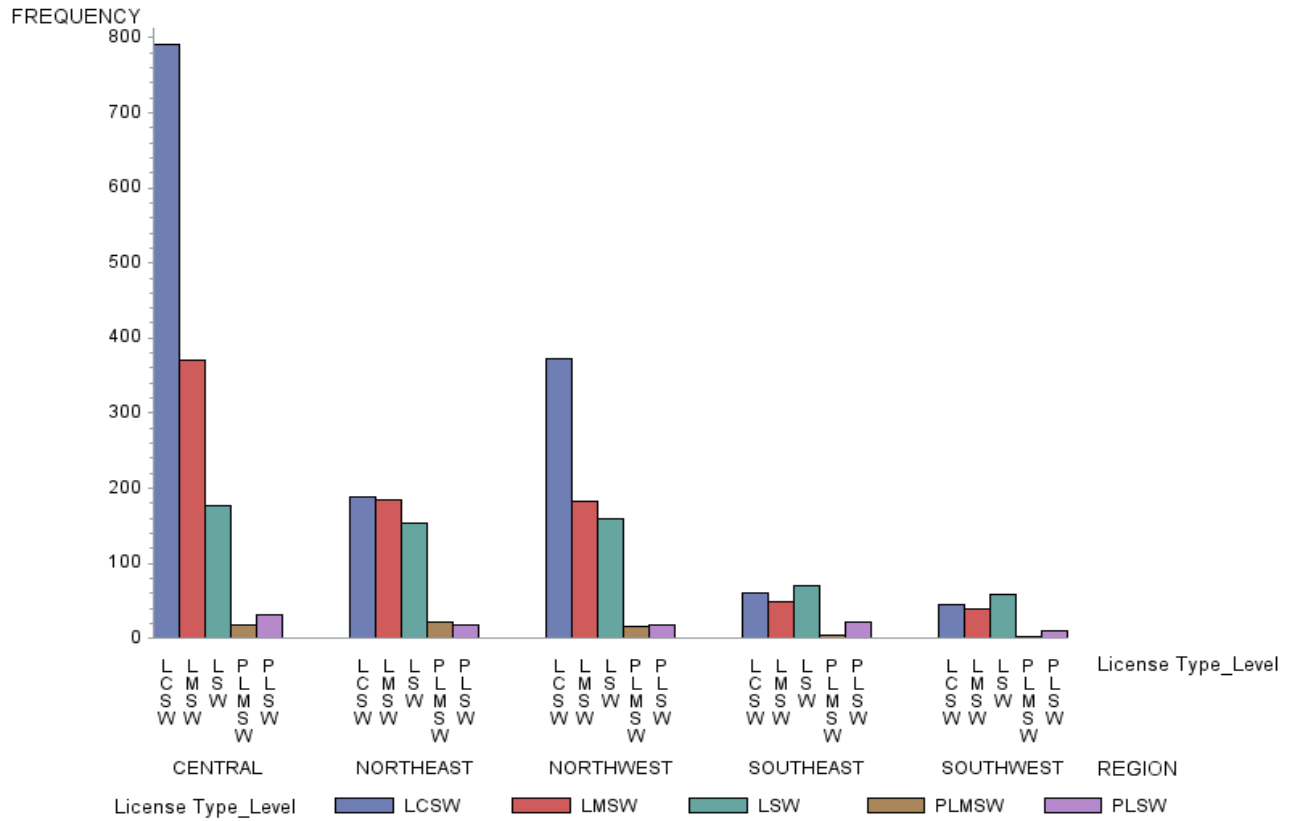

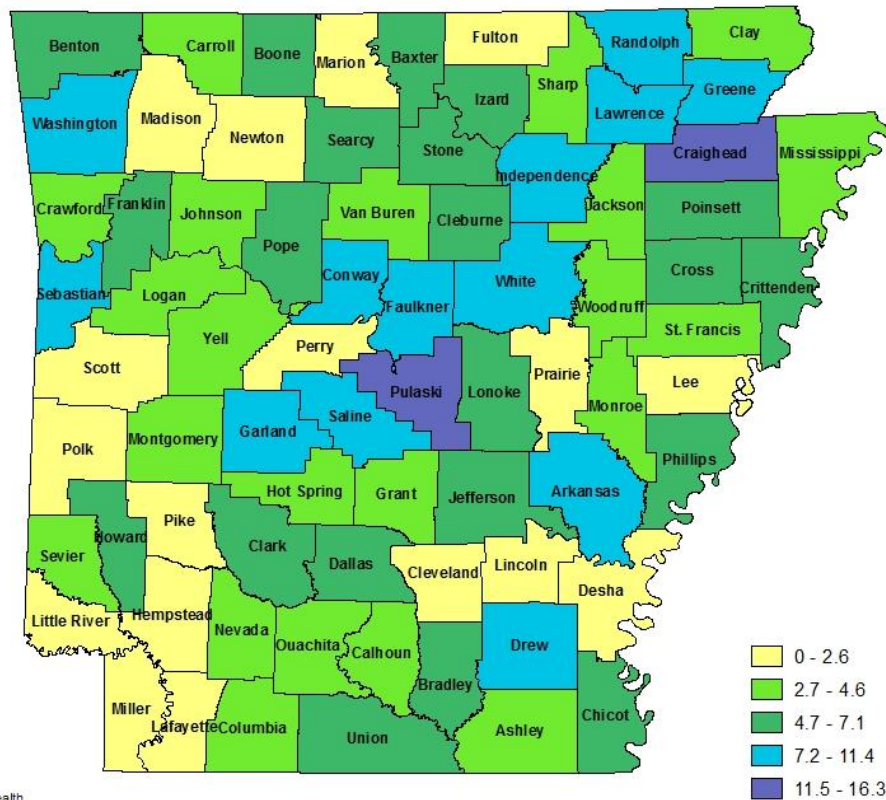

## Speech Pathologists and Audiologists in Arkansas

In 2012, the Speech Pathology and Audiology Board licensed 2,113 speech pathologists, about 7 per 10,000 populations, and 136 audiologists, about 0.5 per 10,000 populations, with mailing addresses in Arkansas. Of the 75 counties in Arkansas, 2 (2.6%) counties had no registered speech pathologists or audiologists and 54 (72%) counties had one or more speech pathologists but no audiologists in the registry.

Per 10,000 Population**



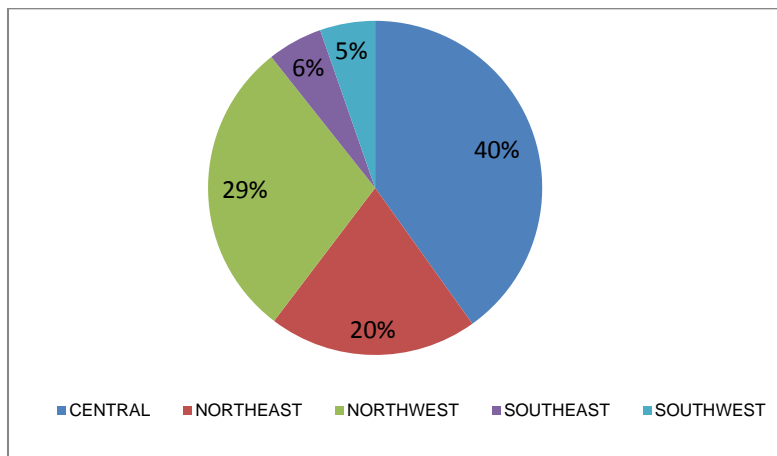

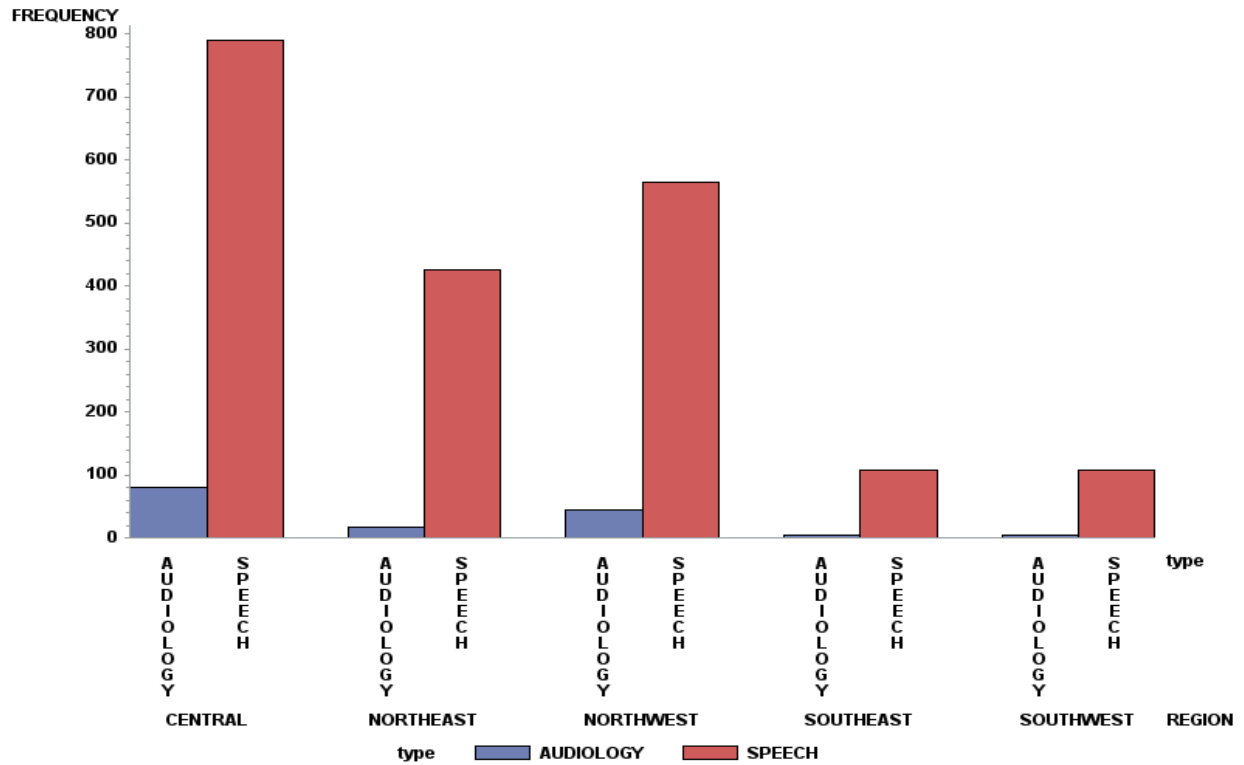

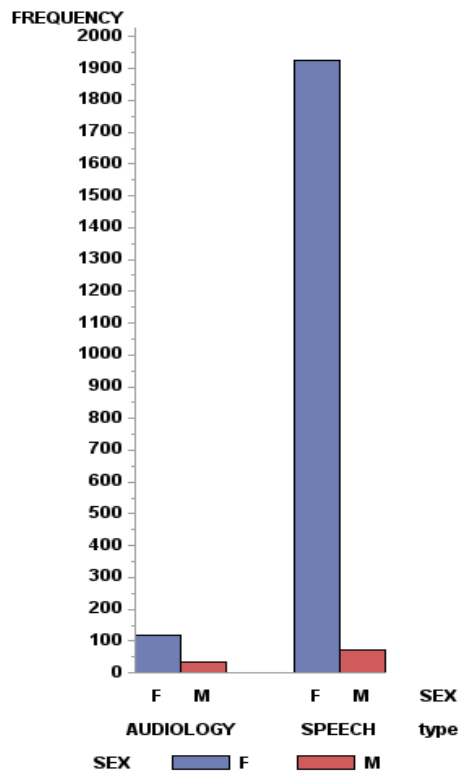

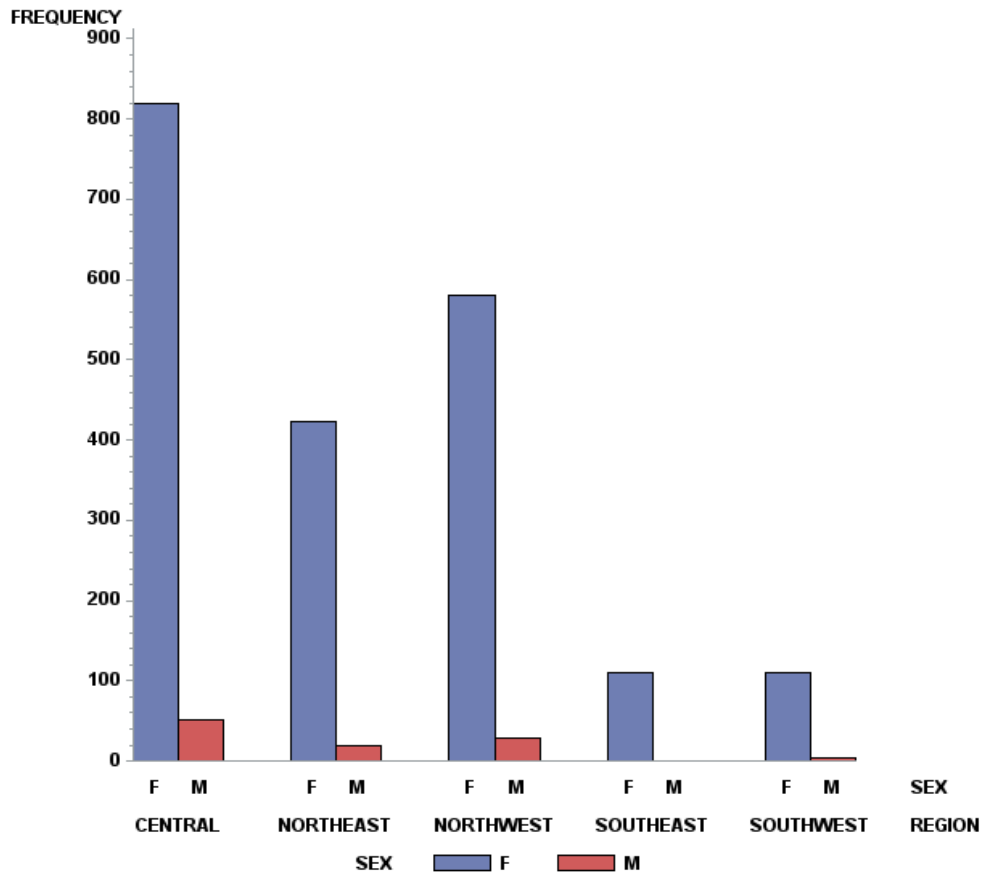
**Speech Pathologists and Audiologists by Regions**

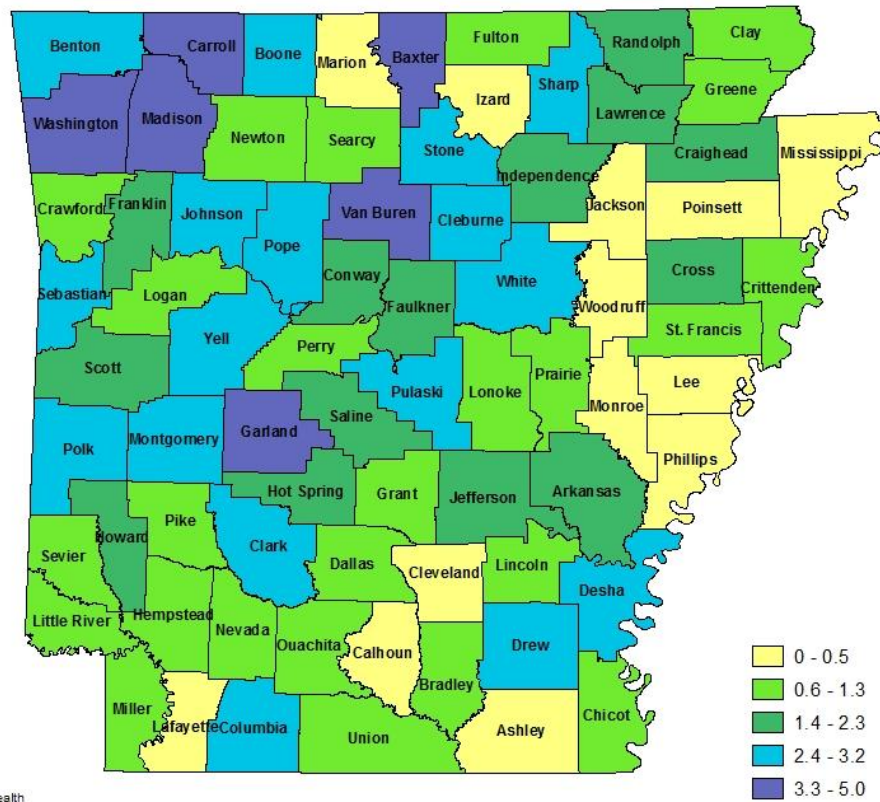

## Veterinarians in Arkansas

In 2012, the Veterinary Board licensed 677 veterinarians with mailing addresses in Arkansas, about 2.3 per 10,000 populations. Of the 75 counties in Arkansas, 8 counties (11%) had no registered veterinarian and 17 other counties (23%) had only one.

## Veterinarians by Counties Per 10,000 Population



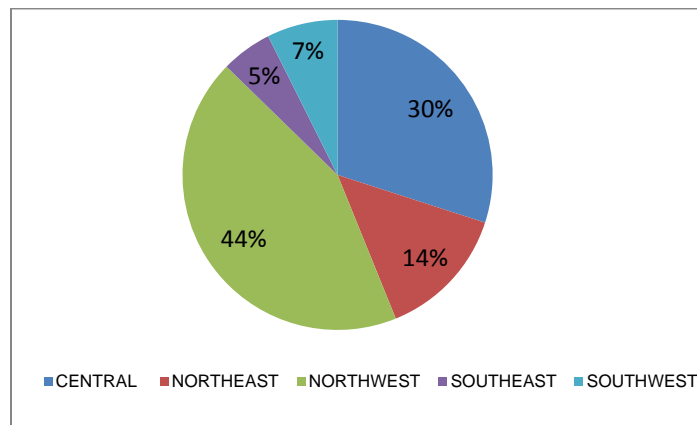
